Supreme Court Act 1935

Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 2) 2002

Made by the Judges of the Supreme Court.

1. Citation

These rules may be cited as the *Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 2) 2002*.

2. The rules amended

The amendments in these rules are to the *Rules of the Supreme Court 1971**.

3. Order 60A amended

Order 60A Rule 1 is amended after paragraph (e) by deleting the full stop and inserting —

4. Heading to Order 81F amended

**Confiscation under the *Criminal Property
Confiscation Act 2000***

Part 1 — Preliminary

1. Interpretation

In this Part, unless the contrary intention appears —

“**Confiscation Act 2000**” means the *Criminal Property Confiscation Act 2000*;

“**confiscable property declaration**” means a declaration under section 28 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**crime-used property substitution declaration**” means a declaration under section 22 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**criminal benefits declaration**” means a declaration under section 16 or 17 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**examination order**” means an order under section 58(1) of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**freezing notice**” means a freezing notice issued under section 34 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**freezing order**” means an order under section 43 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**interstate confiscation declaration**” has the same meaning as in the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**interstate freezing order**” has the same meaning as in the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**monitoring order**” means an order under section 68(1) of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“**objection**” means an objection under section 79 of the Confiscation Act 2000 to the confiscation of property;

“production order” means an order under section 63 of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“sham transaction order” means an order under section 135(2) of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“suspension order” means an order under section 68(2) of the Confiscation Act 2000;

“unexplained wealth declaration” means a declaration under section 12 of the Confiscation Act 2000.

Part 2 — Proceedings under the Confiscation Act 2000

2. Applications for confiscation declarations

- (1) An application by the DPP under section 30(1) of the Confiscation Act 2000 for a declaration that property has been confiscated may be made ex parte.
- (2) If, immediately before the property was confiscated or is alleged to have been confiscated under section 6, 7 or 8 of the Confiscation Act 2000, proceedings in relation to the property were on foot under that Act or the *Misuse of Drugs Act 1981*, an application is made by summons or motion in the proceedings.
- (3) If no proceedings were on foot as mentioned in subrule (2), an application is made by originating motion in Form 64.
- (4) On hearing an application, the court may give any directions it thinks fit, whether or not it finds that the property has been confiscated.

3. Applications for other declarations or orders

- (1) Subject to subrules (2) and (3), an application under the Confiscation Act 2000 for any of the following declarations or orders is made by filing an originating summons in Form 75 —
 - (a) an unexplained wealth declaration;
 - (b) a criminal benefits declaration;
 - (c) a crime-used property substitution declaration;
 - (d) a confiscable property declaration;
 - (e) a freezing order, except an ex parte application;
 - (f) a sham transaction order;
 - (g) an examination order;
 - (h) a production order;
 - (i) a monitoring order;
 - (j) a suspension order;
 - (k) an order under section 85, 91, 93 or 94 of the Confiscation Act 2000.

- (2) If an application for any of the following declarations or orders is made in the course of other proceedings under the Confiscation Act 2000 the application is made by motion in the proceedings —
 - (a) an unexplained wealth declaration;
 - (b) a criminal benefits declaration;
 - (c) a crime-used property declaration;
 - (d) a confiscable property declaration;
 - (e) an examination order;
 - (f) a production order;
 - (g) an order under section 85, 91, 93 or 94 of the Confiscation Act 2000.
- (3) An ex parte application for any of the following orders is made by originating motion in Form 64 —
 - (a) a freezing order;
 - (b) an examination order;
 - (c) a production order;
 - (d) a monitoring order;
 - (e) a suspension order.

4. Affidavit in support of an application

When an application is made in accordance with Rule 3(1) or (3), the applicant must file with the application an affidavit setting out the facts and circumstances on which the application is based.

5. Objections to confiscation of property

- (1) An objection to the confiscation of property frozen under a freezing notice is made by filing an originating summons in Form 75.
- (2) An objection to the confiscation of property frozen under a freezing order is made by summons in the proceedings on the application for the freezing order.

6. Service on DPP

When a party (other than the DPP) files an objection or makes an application under this Order, the party is to serve a copy of the objection or application on the DPP.

7. Directions

- (1) A summons for directions must be filed with an application made by way of originating summons filed in accordance with Rule 3(1) or Rule 5(1) or (2), and is to be given the same return date as the originating summons.

- (2) On the hearing of the application and summons for directions, or on any other application, or of its own motion at any time, the Court may do any or all of the following —
 - (a) inquire as to the persons who may be affected by the relief the plaintiff seeks;
 - (b) for the purpose of an inquiry under paragraph (a) direct the plaintiff and the defendant to give the Court any information it requires;
 - (c) give directions as to the persons to be added as parties as being interested in the relief claimed or to represent classes of persons interested in the relief claimed.

8. Conference not required

Order 59 Rule 9 does not apply to a summons in proceedings under the Confiscation Act 2000.

9. Representative defendant

If a person has been added as a defendant in proceedings under the Confiscation Act 2000, and other persons (including unborn persons) have the same interest as the defendant or a similar interest, the Court may —

- (a) authorise the defendant to defend the proceedings on behalf of or for the benefit of all the interested persons; and
- (b) order that all the interested persons are bound by any order made in the proceedings.

**Part 3 — Registration of freezing notices
and interstate orders**

10. Registration of freezing notices

- (1) A register called the Register of Freezing Notices is to be kept at the Central Office.
- (2) When a freezing notice is filed in the court under section 36(6) of the Confiscation Act 2000, the proper officer must —
 - (a) assign a number to it;
 - (b) enter particulars of the notice in the register; and
 - (c) indorse the notice to the effect that it was registered on the day on which the particulars were entered.

- (3) When a notice of cancellation of a freezing notice is filed in the court under section 40(2)(b) of the Confiscation Act 2000, or a freezing notice is set aside under Part 6 of the Act, the proper officer must enter the cancellation or setting aside in the register.

11. Registration of interstate orders

- (1) A person desiring to register an interstate freezing order or an interstate confiscation order may file a copy of the order sealed with the seal of the court that made the order.
- (2) When a sealed copy of an interstate freezing order is filed, the proper officer must —
 - (a) assign a number to it;
 - (b) enter particulars of the order in The Register of Interstate Restraining Orders kept under Order 81F Rule 18(1); and
 - (c) indorse the order to the effect that it was registered on the day on which the particulars were entered.
- (3) When the registration of an interstate freezing order or an interstate confiscation order is cancelled under section 122 of the Confiscation Act 2000, the proper officer must enter the cancellation in the register.

HEALTH ACT 1911

Shire of Carnarvon

HEALTH AMENDMENT LOCAL LAWS 2002

Made by the Council of the Shire of Carnarvon under section 342 of the Health Act 1911 in accordance with subdivision 2 of Part 3 of the Local Government Act 1995.

Citation

1. These local laws may be cited as the Shire of Carnarvon Health Amendment Local Laws 2002.

Repeal

2. (1) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Carnarvon and published in the *Government Gazette* on 19 February 1915, and amended from time to time, are repealed;

(2) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Carnarvon and published in the *Government Gazette* on 6 February 1948, and amended from time to time, are repealed;

(3) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Carnarvon on 23 October 1956 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 February 1957, and amended from time to time, are repealed; and

(4) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Carnarvon on 24 March 1965 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 26 May 1965, and amended from time to time, are repealed.

Principal local laws

3. In these local laws, the Shire of Carnarvon Health Local Laws 1997 made under the Health Act 1911 and passed by the Council of the Shire of Carnarvon on 28 May 1997, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 23 July 1997, are referred to as the principal local laws.

Principal local laws amended

4. The principal local laws are amended as described in the following schedule—

Shire of Gnowangerup

HEALTH LOCAL LAWS 2002

Made by the Council of the Shire of Gnowangerup under section 342 of the *Health Act 1911* in accordance with subdivision 2 of Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

Citation

1. These Local Laws may be cited as the "*Shire of Gnowangerup Health Local Laws 2002*".

Incorporation by Reference

2. (i) In these Local Laws, "*The Shire of Koorda Health Local Laws 2001*";
- (a) means *The Shire of Koorda Health Local Laws 2001* published in the *Government Gazette*, special edition number 4, on the 11 January 2002; and
- (b) does not include any amendments that might be made to those Local Laws.
- (ii) Subject to the modifications set out in the Schedule, *The Shire of Koorda Health Local Laws 2001* are incorporated with and form part of these Local Laws.

Repeal

3. (1) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Gnowangerup and published in the *Government Gazette* on 4 September 1925, and amended from time to time are repealed;
- (2) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Gnowangerup and published in the *Government Gazette* on 8 November 1935, and amended from time to time are repealed;
- (3) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Gnowangerup on 19 September 1956 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 12 December 1956, and amended from time to time are repealed; and
- (4) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Gnowangerup on 21 February 1968 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 3 July 1968, and amended from time to time are repealed.

LIST OF DECLARED ANIMALS

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

The following applies to the list below—

- If a species does not appear in this list and is not an indigenous animal, it is prohibited as a declared animal in categories A1, A2, A3. The meanings of those categories are summarised below. Of these species some (marked *) have been assessed for entry into the state and have been rejected, so they remain prohibited. Prohibited species should be immediately reported.
- If a species does not appear in this list and is an indigenous species, it is not regulated under the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, but may be regulated under other legislation.
- It is an offence to liberate or attempt to liberate declared animals or to fail to prevent them being at large.
- Conditions for introduction and keeping of declared animals are specified in the Declared Animals regulations or by Board decision and leaflets are available showing requirements for each species.
- Of the species not subject to declaration that are exempt, some (marked #) occur in a commensal or feral state and advice may be obtained from the Agriculture Protection Board on control or management of problems which they may occasionally cause.

- A1** Entry prohibited.
- A2** Subject to eradication in the wild.
- A3** Keeping prohibited.
- A4** Entry subject to Department of Agriculture permits and/or conditions.

FIRE BREAK NOTICE

Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Carnarvon

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, owners or occupiers of land in the Shire of Carnarvon are hereby required to carry out firebreak work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with provisions of this order.

“Fire Break” means ground from which all flammable material has been removed and on which no flammable material is permitted during the fire break period.

“Flammable Material” defined for the purpose of this notice to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act) boxes, cartons paper and the like flammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawn.

Owners or occupiers of land in the Shire of Carnarvon are required to have firebreaks constructed prior to the firebreak period which is from the 1st November 2002 to the 30th April 2003 inclusive.

Persons who fail to comply with requirements of this order may be issued with an Infringement notice Penalty \$100 or prosecuted and face a fine of not more than \$1,000. Additionally Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with the provisions of this order, you may make a Written application for a variation to the order which must reach the Shire Council not less than Fourteen Days prior to the date by which the firebreak is to be established. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area has first signified his approval to the variation by his signature on the written application. If the application is not approved by the Shire Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

1. Townsite Land: In respect of land owned or occupied by you in the Townsite of Carnarvon.
 - (a) Where the area of land is 2024 square metres or less, remove all flammable material on the land from the whole of the land.
 - (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2024 square metres construct firebreaks at least two metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.
 - (c) In respect of any land owned or occupied by you, which there is situated any containers/installation used for the storage of flammable liquid or gas fuel, you shall clear the land of all flammable material.

2. Water Pumping Installations, Gascoyne River Area

All owners of water pumping installations with diesel or petrol driven engines for the pumping of water from the Gascoyne River or its bed are required to construct firebreaks six metres wide on all sides of such pumping installations.

3. Rural Land (other than Townsite Land and Pastoral Properties)

- (a) A firebreak shall be constructed not less than 3 metres in width immediately inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you.
- (b) Where buildings are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than three metres in width must be provided within 100 metres of the perimeter of such buildings in such a manner as to completely encircle the building.

4. Pastoral Buildings

Firebreaks of not less than three metres in width must be provided within 100 metres of the perimeter of such buildings in such a manner as to completely encircle the building.

Special Orders—Section 33

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirements of this order, the Shire Council may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary.

FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to All Owners and Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Coorow

Firebreaks—

Pursuant to the powers in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, you are hereby required on or before 31 OCTOBER 2002 to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter keep clear of all inflammable material until 29 MARCH 2003 firebreaks (of not less than two (2) metres in width in the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you—

1. Rural Land

Firebreaks of not less than two (2) metres in width immediately inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you. In addition, where buildings or haystacks are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than 3.5 metres in width must be provided within 100 metres of the perimeter of such buildings or haystacks, in such manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystacks or fuel pumps.

Where the land is in the Warradarge Bushfire Brigade Area, the firebreak is to be twenty (20) metres wide around scrub areas that is to be burnt.

2. Townsites

Coorow, Leeman and Green Head, all townsite lots must be cleared and kept clear of all accumulation of inflammable materials. (For the purpose of this notice, trees, shrubs and plants in established gardens do not constitute inflammable material).

3. Fuel Dumps and/or Depots

All grass and inflammable material is to be cleared from areas where fuel is stored and such areas are to be maintained free of grass and similar inflammable material until 29 March 2003.

4. Harvesting and Straw Raking, Baling and Chaining Operations

A person shall not operate any harvesting machine or header or undertake straw raking, baling or chaining activities in any crop or paddock during the restricted and prohibited period unless a readily mobile firefighting unit containing a minimum of 400 litres of water capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested, raked, baled or chained.

5. General Provisions

The term "*Inflammable Material*" for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act 1954), timber, boxes, cartons, paper, and the like inflammable materials, rubbish and any combustible matter, but does not include buildings, green standing trees and bushes or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to provide firebreaks in the position or adhere to the provisions required by this notice, the written approval of a Bush Fire Control Officer must be obtained to prepare such firebreaks in an alternative position.

If permission is not granted by a duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this order.

A "*Total Movement Ban*" includes the movement of vehicles in paddocks, except vehicles carrying water to stock and inspecting water supplies to stock.

Harvesting is not permitted on Christmas Day and New Years Day. Harvesting is permitted on all Sundays and other Public Holidays except where a harvesting or movement of vehicles ban has been imposed due to extreme weather conditions.

The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1000) and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Council may, in default of compliance with this Order, enter upon the land and perform the requisite works and the owner or occupier shall be responsible for the costs of performing such works.

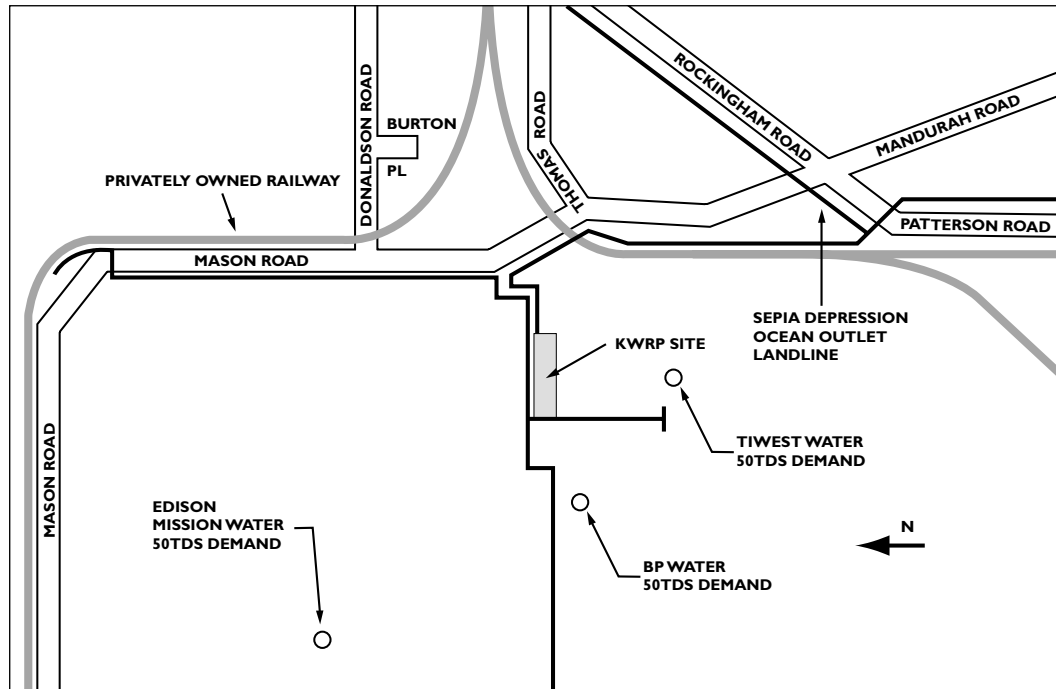
