Agricultural Produce Commission Act 1988

**Agricultural Produce (Egg Production Industry)
Regulations 2006**

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Agricultural Produce (Egg Production Industry) Regulations 2006*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on 1 April 2006.

3. Terms used in these regulations

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears —

“**charge**” means a charge imposed on a producer under the Act section 14;

“**chicken**” means a domestic chicken kept for the commercial production of eggs;

“**duck**” means a domestic duck kept for the commercial production of eggs;

“**Egg Producers’ Committee**” means the producers’ committee established under the Act section 11 for the egg production industry;

“**eggs**” means the eggs of chickens or ducks;

“**producer**” means a person whose business is, or involves, egg production;

“**quarter**” means the period of 3 months ending on 31 December, 31 March, 30 June or 30 September in any year;

“**sale**” includes barter or exchange.

4. Egg producers to pay charges

- (1) A producer who sells eggs produced in the business of the producer must pay a charge to the Commission within 14 days after the end of each quarter in which the producer sold the eggs.

Penalty: a fine of \$2 000.

- (2) The unpaid amount of the charge is a debt due to the State and is recoverable from the producer in a court of competent jurisdiction.

5. Information to be furnished

A producer who sells eggs produced in the business of the producer must, not later than 14 days after the end of each quarter in which eggs were sold, furnish to the Commission a return in the form approved by the Commission showing all of the sales in that quarter.

Penalty: a fine of \$2 000.

6. Prescribed statistical information

- (1) In subregulation (2) —
“**specified**” means specified by the Commission in a notice served on a producer.
- (2) For the purposes of the Act section 13 the following information is prescribed statistical information —
 - (a) the quantity of eggs produced in the business of the producer in a specified period;
 - (b) the number of chickens or ducks owned by the producer in a specified period;
 - (c) the names of the wholesale or retail outlets that sold eggs produced in the business of the producer to consumers in a specified period.

7. Publication of section 14 notices

The Commission must cause each section 14 notice to be published in a newspaper circulating generally in the State.

In these regulations —

“WPC” means Western Power Corporation as constituted under the Act section 188.

4. Function relating to unallocated assets and liabilities

It is a function of WPC to do any thing that the Minister requires WPC to do for the purpose of —

- (a) dealing with an asset or right; or
- (b) discharging a liability,

to which the Act section 169 applies.

- (3) The Electricity Generation Corporation is exempt from the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* section 7(4) in relation to the sale of electricity to —
- (a) Billiton Aluminium (Worsley) Pty Ltd (ACN 088 336 921), Kobe Alumina Associates (Australia) Pty Ltd (ACN 008 907 524) and Nissho Iwai Alumina Pty Ltd (ACN 009 309 344) pursuant to an agreement dated 24 June 1999 for the supply of electricity to premises located at Wellington Location 5314;
 - (b) Tiwest Pty Ltd (ACN 009 343 364) pursuant to an agreement dated 23 October 1997 for the supply of electricity to premises located at Mason Road, Kwinana; and
 - (c) Transfield Services Kemerton Pty Ltd (ACN 109 619 112) as trustee for the Transfield Kemerton Trust pursuant to an agreement dated 8 December 2003 for the supply of electricity to premises located at Marriott Road, Kemerton.

Electricity Transmission and Distribution Systems (Access) Act 1994

Electricity Distribution Access Order 2006

Made by the Minister under the Act Schedule 6 clause 2(1b).

1. Citation

This order is the *Electricity Distribution Access Order 2006*.

2. Terms used in this order

In this order —

“**access**” means access to spare capacity and new capacity;

“**distribution employee**” has the meaning given to that term in the *Electricity Distribution Regulations 1997* regulation 3;

“**distribution entry point**” has the meaning given to that term in the *Electricity Distribution Regulations 1997* regulation 3;

“**distribution exit point**” has the meaning given to that term in the *Electricity Distribution Regulations 1997* regulation 3.

3. Electricity Networks Corporation — access to electricity distribution capacity

- (1) Under the Act Schedule 6 clause 2(1), on and after 1 April 2006 the Electricity Networks Corporation must make available access to an existing or prospective user if —

(a) the user —

- (i) is seeking access for the transportation of electricity from a distribution entry point; and

- (ii) is not seeking access for the transportation of electricity to a distribution exit point;
 - or
 - (b) the user —
 - (i) is seeking access for the transportation of electricity to a distribution exit point (whether or not the user is also seeking access for the transportation of electricity from a distribution entry point); and
 - (ii) meets the requirement in subclause (2).
- (2) For the purposes of subclause (1)(b), the user must be able to demonstrate, to the reasonable satisfaction of the corporation, that, in the period of 12 months beginning on the day on and from which the user wants access to be made available, the amount of electricity transported to the distribution exit point will be at least 50 megawatt hours.

4. Regional Power Corporation — access to electricity distribution capacity

- (1) Under the Act Schedule 6 clause 2(1), on and after 1 April 2006 the Regional Power Corporation must make available access to an existing or prospective user if —
- (a) the user —
 - (i) is seeking access for the transportation of electricity from a distribution entry point; and
 - (ii) is not seeking access for the transportation of electricity to a distribution exit point;
 - or
 - (b) the user —
 - (i) is seeking access for the transportation of electricity to a distribution exit point (whether or not the user is also seeking access for the transportation of electricity from a distribution entry point); and
 - (ii) meets the requirement in subclause (2).
- (2) For the purposes of subclause (1)(b), the user must be able to demonstrate, to the reasonable satisfaction of a distribution employee, that, in the period of 12 months beginning on the day on and from which the user wants access to be made available, the amount of electricity transported to the distribution exit point will be at least 50 megawatt hours.

Electricity Industry (Tariff Equalisation) Regulations 2006

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Treasurer.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Electricity Industry (Tariff Equalisation) Regulations 2006*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on 1 April 2006.

3. Timing of determinations under section 129D(1)

- (1) In this regulation —
“**determination**” means a determination under section 129D(1) of the Act.

- (2) The first determination is to be made before 1 January 2007.
 - (3) The second determination is to be made at an interval of not more than 3 years after the first determination.
 - (4) Each subsequent determination is to be made at an interval of not more than 5 years after the last determination.
- 4. Payment of tariff equalisation contributions under section 129F**
- (1) In this regulation —
 “tariff equalisation contribution” and **“Tariff Equalisation Fund”** have the meanings given to those terms in section 129B of the Act.
 - (2) Each tariff equalisation contribution is to be paid into the Tariff Equalisation Fund in instalments.
 - (3) The amount of each instalment is to be determined by the Treasurer.
 - (4) An instalment is to be paid before the end of each month of the period in respect of which the tariff equalisation contribution is payable.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

Shire of Gingin

AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2006

Under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and by all other powers, the local government of the Shire of Gingin resolved to make the following local law on the 7th day of February 2006.

1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the “Shire of Gingin Amendment Local Law 2006”.

2. Activities in Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Activities in Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

(a) Division 5—Fencing amended—

After the words “Division 5—Fencing” and immediately before the word “Public” insert 2.16.

3. Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

(a) Clause 1.3 amended—

In the definition of “symbol”, delete “1742.11-1989” and substitute “1742.11-1999”.

(b) Clause 4.5 amended—

In subclause (2) delete the words “A person shall not park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is:” and substitute, “Subject to any law

relating to intersections with traffic control signals a person shall not park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is:"

- (c) Clause 10 amended—
 - (i) Delete subclause 10.2
 - (ii) Renumber subclause "3" to "2"

- (d) Schedule 1 amended—

Delete subclause 3 of Schedule 1 and substitute the words—

"any road which comes under the control of the Commissioner of Main Roads unless the control of parking and parking facilities on that road is carried out subject to the control and direction of the Commissioner of Main Roads or has been delegated by the Commissioner to the local government."

4. Local Government Property Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Local Government Property Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

- (a) Clause 1.5(1) amended—
 - Delete "5 September 1975" substitute "1 October 1964".
- (b) Clause 9.4 amended—
 - (i) Delete subclause 9.4(2)
 - (ii) Renumber subclause "(3)" to "(2)"

5. Extractive Industries Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Extractive Industries Local Law 2004, published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

- (a) Clause 3.1 amended—
 - Delete Clause 3.1(4) and substitute—
 - (4) Where the local government approves the issue of a licence, the CEO upon receipt by the local government of—
 - (a) payment of the annual licence fee, or the relevant proportion of the annual licence fee to 31st December next, determined by the local government from time to time;
 - (b) payment of the secured sum if any, imposed under clause 5.1;
 - (c) the documents, if any, executed to the satisfaction of the CEO, under clause 5.1; and
 - (d) A copy of the public liability insurance policy required under Clause 7.1 (1),
- shall issue the licence to the applicant.

6. Bush Fire Brigades Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Bush Fire Brigades Local Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follow—

- (a) Clause 1.2 amended—
 - Delete "4.1" and substitute "4.2".
- (b) Clause 1.3 amended—
 - Delete "10 February 1971" and substitute "20 April 1959"
- (c) Clause 2.5 amended—

Delete Clause 2.5 and substitute the words—

"2.5 Existing Bush Fire Brigades

- (1) Where a local government has established a bush fire brigade prior to the commencement date, then on and from the commencement day—
 - (a) the bush fire brigade is to be taken to be a bush fire brigade established under and in accordance with this local law;
 - (b) the provisions of this local law apply to the bush fire brigade save for clause 2.2; and
 - (c) any rules governing the operation of the bush fire brigade are to be taken to have been repealed and substituted with the Rules.

(2) In this clause—

“**commencement day**” means the day on which this local law comes into operation.”

7. Repeal Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Repeal Local Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

(a) In dot point 7 delete “21 January 1968” and substitute “23 January 1968”

8. Cemeteries Local Law 2004

The Shire of Gingin Cemeteries Local Law 2004 published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 September 2004 is amended as follows—

(a) First Schedule amended—

In Item No 2 delete “5.4” and substitute “5.3”.

City of Wanneroo

REPEAL LOCAL LAW 2005

Under the powers conferred by the *Bushfires Act 1954* and *Local Government Act 1995* and by all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Wanneroo resolved on 14 March 2006 to make the following local law.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Title

This local law may be cited as the *City of Wanneroo Repeal Local Law 2005*.

1.2 Commencement

This local law comes into operation on the 14th day after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

1.3 Purpose and Effect

This Local Law repeals an outdated local law and is intended to result in more efficient and effective Local Government by removing an outdated Local Law.
