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NEW FORMAT FOR GENERAL GOVERNMENT GAZETTES

For ease of access to particular notices the general Gazette will be divided into two parts as detailed below. In each part, the notices will appear in alphabetical order of the authorising Department.

Part 1 will contain Proclamations, Regulations, Rules, Local Laws and various other Instruments etc. but not Town Planning Schemes.

Part 2 will contain general notices and information and Town Planning Schemes.

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The Western Australian *Government Gazette* is published by State Law Publisher for the State of Western Australia on Tuesday and Friday of each week unless disrupted by Public Holidays or unforeseen circumstances (changes to this arrangement will be advertised beforehand on the inside cover).

Special *Government Gazettes* containing notices of an urgent or particular nature are published periodically.

The following guidelines should be followed to ensure publication in the *Government Gazette*.

- Material submitted to the Executive Council prior to gazettal will require a copy of the signed Executive Council Minute Paper and in some cases the Parliamentary Counsel's Certificate.
- Copy should be received by the Manager (Sales and Editorial), State Law Publisher no later than 12 noon on Wednesday (Friday edition) or 12 noon on Friday (Tuesday edition).

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- Lengthy or complicated notices should be forwarded early to allow for preparation. Failure to observe this request could result in the notice being held over.

If it is necessary through isolation or urgency to fax copy, confirmation is not required by post. *If original copy is forwarded later and published, the cost will be borne by the advertiser.*

Deceased Estate notices, (per estate)—\$17.70

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Other articles in Public Notices Section—\$41.30 (except items of an exceptionally large nature. In these instances arrangements will be made for pricing the notice at time of lodging).

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Per Column Centimetre—\$8.15

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Clients who have an account will be invoiced for advertising charges.

Clients without an account will need to pay at time of lodging the notice.

PUBLISHING ALTERATIONS

Periodically the normal *Gazette* publishing times need to be altered to cater for disruption caused by public holidays.

- Easter and Christmas holidays cause disruption each year.
- Australia Day and Anzac Day cause disruption when they fall on a Tuesday or Friday.

In these instances, notices warning of the change are generally published on page 2 for approximately 4 weeks prior to the date.

Readers are urged to check *Gazettes* accordingly, prior to contacting State Law Publisher.

These regulations may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1999*.

PROHIBITION ON COMMERCIAL FISHING FOR CRABS (GEOGRAPHE BAY) ORDER 1999
Order No. 8 of 1999

FD 1620/98 [298]

Made by the Minister under section 43.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Prohibition on Commercial Fishing for Crabs (Geographe Bay) Order 1999*.

Interpretation

2. In this order, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “crabs” means all fish described by the scientific classification *Portunus*, *Scylla* and *Ovalipes* spp.;
 - “school holidays” means the vacation periods for primary and secondary schools as determined by an order made in accordance with regulation 38C of the *Education Regulations 1960*;
 - “sunrise” and “sunset” mean the times provided by the Perth Astronomical Observatory for sunrise and sunset on the relevant day.

Prohibition on commercial fishing for crabs

3. A person must not fish for crabs for a commercial purpose in the waters described in—
- (a) Schedule 1—
 - (i) on any Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
 - (ii) on any day which is a school holiday, other than the vacation period which commences at the end of the second school term in any year and ends at the commencement of the third school term in the same year;
 - (iii) at any time during the period commencing one hour after sunrise and ending one hour before sunset on any day to which subparagraphs (i) and (ii) of this paragraph do not apply; or
 - (b) Schedule 2 at any time.

Revocation

4. The order, published in the *Gazette* as Notice No 427 *Geographe Bay Crabbing Restrictions Notice 1989* on 1 December 1989, is revoked.

Schedule 1—Waters of Geographe Bay

All the waters of Geographe Bay lying south of a line drawn from the intersection of 33° 31.9' south latitude and 115° 0.2' east longitude (North West tip of Cape Naturaliste) to the intersection of 33° 18.15' south latitude and 115° 38.65' east longitude (McKenna Point Lighthouse) excluding the waters described in Schedule 2.

Schedule 2—Busselton Jetty and Adjacent Area

1. Busselton Jetty—All waters of Geographe Bay within 800 metres of the Busselton Jetty.

The land has been identified as the site for a railway transit station on the proposed South West Metropolitan Railway.

PURPOSE OF THE PLANNING CONTROL AREA

The Commission considers that the Planning Control Area is required to ensure that no development occurs on this land which might prejudice this purpose until it may be reserved for the purpose of Railways in the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

DURATION AND EFFECTS
