1. The exception of any loan consultant continues only for so long as that loan consultant continues to be an employee or agent of Aussie, disclosed as such to the Ministry of Fair Trading ("the Ministry");

4. In respect of each franchisee’s business, the particular franchisee and Mortgage Choice are jointly and severally liable for the duration of this exception to ensure that—

Transitional provision relating to certain members — s. 9.71

13. (1) To avoid doubt it is declared that for the purposes of the application of Part 2, Division 5 and section 2.32 of the Act to —

- (a) the remainder of the term of office of a member of a council referred to in clause 6 of Schedule 9.3; or
- (b) the term of office of a member of a council elected at an election referred to in clause 13 of Schedule 9.3,

the member is to be regarded as being an elector of the district so long as he or she continues to —

- (c) reside in the district; or
- (d) be, within the meaning of the former provisions, the owner or occupier of rateable property in the district.

Definition

2. In this By-law unless the context requires otherwise:

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960;

“authorised officer” means a Ranger appointed by Council

“Clerk” means the Chief Executive/Town Clerk of the Town of Cottesloe;

“Council” means the Municipality of the Town of Cottesloe;

“entertain” includes mime, juggle, dance or an acrobatic display;

“licence” means a licence issued pursuant to this By-law;

“licence holder” means a person who holds a valid licence;

“perform” means play a musical instrument or sing;

“public place” has the same meaning as in the Act;

“street” has the same meaning as in the Act.

Application of By-law

3. This By-law applies with respect to any street or public place within the boundaries of the Municipality of the Town of Cottesloe.

Offences

4. (a) No person shall entertain or perform in any street unless he or she is the holder of a licence.
(b) A licence holder shall not entertain or perform in any street at any time other than that specified in the licence.
(c) A licence holder shall not entertain or perform in any street on any day other than that specified in the licence.
(d) A licence holder shall not use any loud speakers or amplification of any kind.

Application and Fee

5. (a) Any person seeking the issue of a licence shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule and shall forward the application to the Clerk together with the fee described in sub-clause (b) of this Clause.
(b) The fee payable upon application for the issue of a licence is \$5.00 per day, per site.

Issue

6. The Clerk or an authorised officer, in his or her discretion, may issue or refuse to issue a licence.

Licence

7. A licence shall be in the form of the Second Schedule.

Licence—Permitted Times

8. Permitted times for performances and entertainment will be between the hours of 10.00am to 9.00pm, Monday to Friday and 10.00am to 5.00pm, Saturday and Sunday.

Validity

9. A licence shall be valid for a period of one or more days, as specified in the licence.

Cancellation

10. The Clerk may cancel a licence if—
 - (a) the Clerk has cause to believe the licence holder has breached a provision of this By-law; or
 - (b) the volume of sound caused by the licence holder in connection with his or her performance or entertainment, in the opinion of the Clerk or an authorised officer, adversely affects the enjoyment, convenience or comfort of other persons in the street, public place or property nearby or adjoining the street or public place; or
 - (c) the Clerk or an authorised officer considers the licence holder to be causing a nuisance, or disruption, using profanity, or being indecent or obscene.

Production

11. A licence holder shall produce his or her licence forthwith upon being required to do so by the Clerk or his or her Authorised Officer.

Penalty

12. A person who fails to comply with any provision of this By-law commits an offence and on conviction is liable to a penalty of not more than \$1,000.

LG308**DOG ACT 1976***Municipality of the Shire of Chittering***BY-LAWS RELATING TO DOGS**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of January, 1996 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

Citation

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Shire of Chittering By-laws relating to dogs. From the date of coming into operation of these by-laws, by-laws relating to dogs gazetted on 13 December, 1929 and dog kennels gazetted on 29 December, 1972 are hereby repealed.

Part I—Interpretation

2. In these By-laws unless the context requires otherwise—

"Act" means the Dog Act 1976; (as amended)

"Authorised Person" means a person who is authorised by or under section 29 of the Dog Act;

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Chittering;

"District" means the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Chittering;

“Public Building” means a public building as defined in section 173 of the Health Act 1911;

“Regulations” means the Dog Regulations 1976; (as amended)

“Schedule” means a schedule to these By-laws;

“Townsite” means that portion of land delineated and gazetted as a townsite under the Land Act 1933, or land, including privately owned declared by Order to be a townsite for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960.

Part II—Impounding of Dogs

3. The pound maintained by the Council for the detention of dogs seized in accordance with the provisions of the Act shall be located on Lot pt 5 Great Northern Highway, Bindoon.

4. The fees and charges in relation to the seizure and maintenance of a dog in accordance with section 29 (4) of the Act, and the fees payable in relation to a dog having been destroyed at the request of its owner are specified in the First Schedule attached hereto.

5. An owner or person liable for the control of a dog is not excused from liability under the provisions of the Act, or any regulation or by-law made thereunder by virtue of the payment of fees or charges prescribed herein for the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog.

Part III—Exercise Areas

6. The land specified in the Second Schedule to these By-laws is designated as Dog Exercise Areas for the purpose of the Act. The exercising of dogs in the dog exercise areas are subject to the provisions of the Act.

Part IV—Keeping of Dogs

7. The owner or occupier of any premises—

(a) Within the townsites of Bindoon, Muchea and Wannamal and within special rural zones shall not keep or permit to be kept more than two (2) dogs over the age of three (3) months; or,

(b) Within rural zones shall not keep or permit to be kept more than three (3) dogs over the age of three (3) months;

unless such premises are:-

(i) Licensed as an approved kennel establishment, or

(ii) Exempted under section 26 (3) of the Act

8. (1) The owner or occupier of premises within a townsite on which a dog is kept shall cause the premises or portion of the premises to be fenced or enclosed in a manner capable of confining the dog in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws.

(2) A fence used to confine a dog and every part of such fence shall, having regard to the species, age, size and physical condition of the dog, prevent the dog from passing over, under or through the fence.

9. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form of the Third Schedule.

10. Unless the Council directs otherwise a person seeking the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall at least 14 days before the application is made to Council; and

(a) publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a notice of the intention to submit an application for a licence and specifying that any interested persons may within 14 days after the date of publication object to or make representations in respect of the application in writing directly to the Council; and

(b) forward a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining land and premises.

11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in the form of the Fifth Schedule.

12. The fees payable for the issue or renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment are specified in the First Schedule.

13. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall remain valid until 31 October next following the issue thereof.

14. A person seeking the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall make application to the Council in or substantially in the form of the Third Schedule.

15. A person shall not erect a kennel unless and until plans and specifications of all kennels and yards appurtenant thereto and a location plan showing the kennels and yards and all other buildings, structures and fences have been approved by Council.

16. The occupier of premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall ensure that the dogs in the establishment are kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question and in accordance with the following requirements—

(a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto which is capable of retaining the dogs within its confines;

- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 5 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;
 - (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 30 metres from the front road or street;
 - (d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 15 metres from any dwelling, church, school room, hall, factory, dairy or any premises wherein food is manufactured, prepared packed or stored for human consumption;
 - (e) the walls of each kennel shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound, and shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, fibro cement, galvanised iron or other material approved by Council;
 - (f) the roof of each kennel shall be constructed of galvanised iron, concrete or other impervious material approved by Council;
 - (g) all external surfaces shall be kept in good condition and where directed by Council, shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
 - (h) the lowest internal height of the kennel shall be at least two metres from the floor;
 - (i) each yard for a kennel shall be securely fenced with a fence no less than two metres in height constructed of galvanised mesh or netting or other material approved by Council;
 - (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of securely fastening;
 - (k) the upper surface of a kennel floor shall be at least 10 cms above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a surface having a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
 - (l) all floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
 - (m) the floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of a kennel;
 - (n) the floor area of each kennel shall be an area of not less than one square metre for every dog kept therein over the age of three months;
 - (o) the yard of any kennel shall be an area of not less than 2.5 square metres for every dog over the age of three months kept therein;
 - (p) all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean disinfected and sanitary condition and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.
 - (q) each kennel shall be constructed as far as is practicable with materials which prevent or minimise emission of noise therefrom;
17. The holder of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall:-
- (a) maintain the establishment in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition;
 - (b) dispose of all refuse, faeces and food waste daily in a manner approved by the Council; and
 - (c) take all practical measures for the destruction of fleas, flies and other vermin.

Part V—General

18. Any person liable for the control of a dog as defined in section 3 (1) of the Act, who allows that dog to excrete on any street or public place within the District commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the consent of the occupier or in such other manner as the Council may approve.

19. Subject to by-law 20 of these By-laws, any person liable for the control of a dog as defined in section 3 (1) of the Act, who allows that dog to excrete on any land within the District without the consent of the occupier of that land commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with approval of the occupier or in such manner as the Council may approve.

20. Except in the case of a bona fide guide dog, a person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:-

- (a) a public building;
- (b) a theatre;
- (c) a house of worship;
- (d) any shop, not being a pet shop or premises used for the purpose of the practice of a registered veterinary surgeon.

21. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provisions of the By-laws commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00.
