Builders' Registration Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2001

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Builders' Registration Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2001*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the later of—

- (a) the start of the day on which they are published in the *Gazette*; or
- (b) immediately after Part 9 of the *Corporations (Consequential Amendments) Act 2001* comes into operation.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Builders' Registration Regulations**.

4. Regulation 1A inserted

After regulation 1 the following regulation is inserted —

“

1A. Interpretation — limiting the definition of company

(1) For the purposes of the definition of “Company” in section 2 of the Act, the following registered bodies are specified —

- (a) a registered Australian body that was formed or incorporated in the State;
- (b) a registered Australian body that was not formed or incorporated in the State and that does not have its head office or principal place of business in the State.

(2) In this regulation —

“**registered Australian body**” has the meaning given by the *Corporations Act 2001* of the Commonwealth.

A dentist who advertises, or causes to be advertised, any material relating to the dentist’s practice of dentistry that —

- (a) is false, misleading, or deceptive;
- (b) creates an unjustified expectation of beneficial treatment; or
- (c) promotes the unnecessary or inappropriate use of the dentist’s services,

commits an offence.

Penalty: \$200.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995*City of Wanneroo*

Standing Orders Amendment

It is hereby notified that the City of Wanneroo has, on the 12th June 2001, amended its Standing Orders Local Law as gazetted on the 27th October 2000 (No. 226) as follows—

“(1) *INSERT after clause 12.2.2 new clauses 12.3 to 12.5 as follows—*

12.3 Personal Explanations

No Member is to speak at any meeting of the Council, except upon the matter before the council, unless it is to make a personal explanation. Any member of the Council who is permitted to speak under these circumstances is to confine the observations to a succinct statement relating to a specific part of the former speech which may have been misunderstood. When a Member of the Council is invited to speak, no reference is to be made to matters unnecessary for that purpose.

12.4 Personal Explanations—When Heard

A Member of the Council wishing to make a personal explanation of matters referred to by any Member of the Council then speaking, is entitled to be heard immediately, if the Member of the Council then speaking consents at the time, but if the member of the Council who is speaking declines to give way, the explanation is to be offered at the conclusion of that speech.

12.5 Ruling On Questions Of Personal Explanation

The ruling of the person presiding on the admissibility of a personal explanation is final unless a motion of dissent with the ruling is moved before any other business proceeds.

LG501***BUSH FIRES ACT 1954***Shire of Wongan-Ballidu*

Notice to all land owners and occupiers within the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the 14th day of October 2001, to plough, scarify, cultivate, spray or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 31st day of March 2002 firebreaks in the following dimensions, on the land owned or occupied by you.

1. TOWN SITES

1.1 Where the area is 2,000 square metres or less, remove all annual grass and herbage.

1.2 Where the area is greater than 2,000 square metres but less than 10,000 square metres, construct a firebreak not less than two metres in width immediately inside all external boundaries and immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

1.3 Where the area is greater than 10,000 square metres construct a firebreak of not less than three metres in width immediately inside all external boundaries and immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

2. FUEL DUMPS AND/OR DEPOTS

All grass and inflammable material is to be cleared from areas where fuel is stored and such areas are to be maintained free of grass and similar inflammable material until the 31st day of March 2002.

3. RURAL LAND

Firebreaks of not less than three metres in width immediately inside and along the whole external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied by you. In addition, firebreaks of at least three metres in width are required surrounding, and not more than fifty metres from the perimeter of any building, group of farm buildings, haystack or fuel storage situated on the land.

4. HARVESTING AND STRAW RAKING, BALING AND CHAINING OPERATIONS

A person shall not operate any harvesting machine or header or undertake straw raking, baling or churning activities in any crop or paddock during the restricted and prohibited period unless a readily mobile firefighting unit containing a minimum of 400 litres of water capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested, raked, baled or chained.

5. GENERAL PROVISIONS

The term "*Inflammable Material*" for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act 1954), timber, boxes, cartons, paper, and the like inflammable materials, rubbish and any combustible matter, but does not include buildings, green standing trees and bushes or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to provide firebreaks in the position or adhere to the provisions required by this notice, the written approval of a Bush Fire Control Officer must be obtained to prepare such firebreaks in an alternative position.

If permission is not granted by a duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this order.

A "*Total Movement Ban*" includes the movement of vehicles in paddocks, except vehicles carrying water to stock and inspecting water supplies to stock.

Harvesting is not permitted on Christmas Day and New Years Day. Harvesting is permitted on all Sundays and other Public Holidays except where a harvesting or movement ban has been imposed due to extreme weather conditions.

The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1000) and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

The Shire of Wongan-Ballidu conducts aerial inspections of firebreaks.

FIRE BREAK ORDER

Important information relating to your responsibility as a Landholder in
the Donnybrook/Balingup Shire

With reference to Section 33 of the Bush Fire Act, 1954-79, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work MUST be carried out by 1st December 2001 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31st March 2002. An inspection of fire breaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an authorised officer.

Person's who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an infringement notice (penalty \$100) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, council may carry out the required work at the cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear fire breaks or remove flammable materials as required by this notice or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary you may apply to the council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November 2001 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the council or it's duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

1. RURAL LAND

- (a) On land which is divided by or abuts a formed or partly formed road or railway reserve, a firebreak not less than three metres wide shall be provided within 60 metres of the boundary of the road or railway reserve. Breaks ARE NOT permitted on road reserves without Council approval.
- (b) A firebreak two metres wide shall be provided immediately surrounding and within twenty metres of the perimeter of all buildings, hay sheds and fuel storage areas situated on the land.
- (c) A cleared area of at least a six metre radius shall be provided around all combustion pumping engines.

2. EUCALYPTUS AND PINE PLANTATIONS

- (a) Firebreaks not less than ten metres in width around the perimeter of land on which trees are planted.
- (b) Not less than ten metres in width along those portions of plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve.
- (c) Not less than six metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a plantation shall exceed 28ha in area.
- (d) Where ten metre breaks are required in accordance with this Section of Council Fire Break Order, pruning of overhang shall be carried out up to a height of five (5) metres above the firebreak (ground level).
- (e) In addition to the breaks specified, plantations traversed by Western Power transmission lines shall have additional obligations under the Electricity Act.

3. TOWNSITES LAND: (INCLUDES RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LAND)

Townsites: Donnybrook, Balingup, Kirup, Mullalyup, Newlands, Preston and Noggerup.

- (a) Where the area of land is 2024m² (approx. ½ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living trees, shrubs and plants from the whole land, and;
- (b) Where the land exceeds 2024m² (approx. ½ acre) clear firebreaks at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land, and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Grass on the remaining area of the land must be either grazed, cut for fodder, or totally removed from the land.
- (c) Council on the recommendation of a Bush Fire Control Officer, may vary these conditions in certain circumstances.

4. RURAL RESIDENTIAL AND SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL LAND

The owners of all land zoned as "Rural Residential" or "Special Residential" under Town Planning Schemes No. 4, shall maintain a firebreak not less than three metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land. A low fuel zone of twenty metres wide shall be provided immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Grass on the remaining area of the land must be either grazed (within conventional practice), cut fodder or completely removed from the land.

5. FUEL AND/OR GAS DEPOT

In respect of land owned by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.

6. WELDING, CUTTING AND GRINDING EQUIPMENT

Persons shall not operate welding, cutting or grinding apparatus of any kind during the Prohibited Burning Times on land which is under crop, pasture or stubble unless at least one fire extinguisher is provided and there is compliance with any other fire controls required by the Fire Control Officer.

7. ROADSIDE VERGES

Council policy is that no vegetation is to be removed from the road verges and no verge is to be burnt without a permit for that specific purpose.
