- (iv) Northeast from the prolongation of Rich Road Stratham for a distance of 300 metres.

PARKING AND PARKING FACILITIES LOCAL LAW 2007

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Capel resolved on 14th February 2007 to make the Shire of Capel Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2007.

The Town of Cottesloe Parking and Parking Facilities Local law as published in the *Government Gazette* of 10 December 2001 is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Capel, with the modifications which follow—

1. Preliminary

- 1.1 On construing the following modifications, where a modification requires the renumbering of a Part, clause, subclause or paragraph, subsequent modifications have been drafted on the basis that the renumbering has been effected.
- 1.2 Where “Town of Cottesloe” is mentioned in the Local Law substitute “Shire of Capel”.

2. Clause 1.2—Repeal

Delete clause 1.2 and substitute—

“The Shire of Capel Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law as published in the *Government Gazette* of 21 February 2001 is repealed”.

3. Clause 1.3—Interpretation

- 3.1 Delete the definitions of ‘metered space’, ‘parking meter’ and ‘ticket issuing machine’.
- 3.2 In the definition of ‘parking facilities’ delete ‘metered zones, metered spaces’ and ‘with or without charge’
- 3.3 In the definition of ‘parking stall’, delete’, but does not include a metered space’.

3.4 In the definition of 'parking station', delete 'with or without charge, but does not include a metered zone or metered space'.

4. Clause 1.6—Classes of Vehicles

Delete the paragraph designations (c), (d), (e) and (f) and substitute (b), (c), (d) and (e).

5. Parts deleted and renumbered

5.1 Delete the whole of Parts 2 and 8.

5.2 Delete Clause 10.2 and renumber 10.3 as 10.2

5.3 Renumber Parts 3 to 7 inclusive to 2 to 6 respectively and 9 and 10 to 7 and 8 respectively.

6. Clauses renumbered

6.1 In renumbered Parts, renumber each clause so that the first number of each clause corresponds with the part number.

7. General Prohibitions on Parking

In clauses 3.5(2)(e) and 3.5(2)(k) delete 10 meters and substitute 20 meters.

8. Schedule 1—Parking Region

After the first four words delete 'divided into two sectors, Sector A and Sector B, that together are'; and

Delete all words and the plan which follow paragraph (3).

9. Schedule 2—Prescribed Offences

Delete Schedule 2 and substitute the following—

Pursuant to Section 55 of the above Act, I hereby authorise the following person to be a hazard management officer for the purposes of the Act—

- FESA Chief Operations Officer

The powers available to the above hazard management officer, under Part 6 of the above Act, may only be exercised at the direction of the FESA State Duty Director to prevent or minimise—

- (i) loss of life, prejudice to the safety, or harm to the health, of persons or animals;
- (ii) destruction of, or damage to, property; or
- (iii) destruction of, or damage to, any part of the environment.

The powers under Part 6 include the power to—

- obtain identifying particulars;
- direct or prohibit the movement of persons, animals and vehicles within, into, out of or around an emergency area;
- direct the evacuation and removal of persons or animals from the emergency area or any part of it;
- close any road, access route or area of water in or leading to the emergency area;
- utilise a vehicle in any place and in any circumstance despite any provision of the *Road Traffic Act 1974* that would require a permit for such use;

- take control of, or make use of any place, vehicle or other thing—inside or outside of the emergency area;
- detain, quarantine, decontaminate any person who has been exposed to a hazardous substance; and
- exchange information.
