Pearling Act 1990

Pearling (General) Amendment Regulations 2003

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Pearling (General) Amendment Regulations 2003*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which section 6 of the *Acts Amendment (Australian Datum) Act 2000* comes into operation.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Pearling (General) Regulations 1991**.

4. Geocentric Datum of Australia

- (2) The reference ellipsoid for the GDA is the Geodetic Reference System 1980 (“**GRS80**”) ellipsoid with a semi-major axis of 6 378 137 m exactly and an inverse flattening (1/f) of 298.257 222 101.

- (3) The reference frame for the GDA is realised by the coordinates of the following Australian Fiducial Network geodetic stations referred to the GRS80 ellipsoid determined within the International Earth Rotation Service Terrestrial Reference Frame 1992 (ITRF92) at the epoch of 1994.0 —

INTENTION TO REMOVE ENTRY IN THE REGISTER OF HERITAGE PLACES

In accordance with the requirements of Section 54(2) of the *Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990*, the Heritage Council hereby gives notice that it is proposed to amend the entry in the Register on a permanent basis in respect of the Place being Victoria Park Rotunda, Kalgoorlie.

The reason for the proposed amendment is to give effect to an agreement transferring ownership of the Rotunda which was previously situated in Victoria Park, Kalgoorlie to the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the consequent relocation in 2001 of the Rotunda from Victoria Park, Kalgoorlie to Hammond Park, Kalgoorlie. BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Koorda

ANNUAL FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land Within the Shire of Koorda

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are hereby required, on all land owned or occupied by you to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn, chemically spray or otherwise clear of all flammable material, and to the following requirements on or before 31st October 2003 or within fourteen (14) days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier, should this be after the 31st October 2003, and until 15th April 2004.

Rural Land—

- On all land owned or occupied which is not within a townsite subdivision, firebreaks not less than three (3) metres wide must be cleared inside and along the external boundary of all land.
- For the purpose of this part, all Road Reserves are to be taken as boundaries.
- The maximum area allowed with a single perimeter firebreak must not exceed 400 hectares.
- Where buildings or hay stacks are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than three (3) metres in width must be provided within ten (10) metres of all homesteads, buildings, hay stacks and fuel ramps/bulk fuel.

HARVESTING EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS— when harvesting is in progress owners/occupiers of land shall have a mobile fire fighting unit in working order with a minimum of 400 litres of water on, or immediately adjacent to the paddock being harvested.

Townsite Land—

- All lots within townsites are required to be completely cleared of all debris of any inflammable nature and maintained free of such material.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with the provisions of the Order, a written application for a variation may be made to the Chief Executive Officer, to reach him not less than two weeks prior to the date by which the firebreak(s), are to be cleared.

No such application will be considered unless it bears the signature of the Fire Control Officer for the area in which the property is situated signifying that the Officer's agreement to the variation applied for.

Failure to comply with this notice shall subject the offender to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fires Act 1954 (as amended).
