HEALTH ACT 1911**SHIRE OF TRAYNING HEALTH LOCAL LAWS 2002**

Made by the Council of the Shire of Trayning under section 342 of the *Health Act 1911* in accordance with subdivision 2 of Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

Citation

1. These Local Laws may be cited as the “*Shire of Trayning Health Local Laws 2002*”.

Incorporation by Reference

2. (i) In these Local Laws, “*The Shire of Koorda Health Local Laws 2001*”;

- (b) does not include any amendments that might be made to those Local Laws
- (ii) Subject to the modifications set out in the Schedule, *The Shire of Koorda Health Local Laws 2001* are incorporated with and form part of these Local Laws.

Repeal

3. (1) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Trayning and published in the *Government Gazette* on 19 June 1925 and amended from time to time, are repealed;

The national Consultative Committee on Exotic Animal Diseases has, on 8 May 2002 confirmed the diagnosis of Virulent Newcastle Disease in the State of Victoria.

For the purpose of the *Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1993*, the following conditions/prohibitions apply to importation into Western Australia of—

Species of animals:	Avian
Animal Products:	All Avian
Conditions/prohibitions:	Except as approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer, a person must not move any avian animal or any avian animal product into Western Australia, from an area of the State of Victoria declared under a law of that State to be a Restricted Area or a Control Area for the purpose of controlling Virulent Newcastle Disease.

Unless sooner revoked, this order applies for a period of thirty (30) days commencing on the day it is published in the *Gazette*.
