WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 6852/51—That reserve No. 23545 at Marvel Loch should vest in and be held by the Yilgarn Road Board in trust for Recreation.

Corr. No. 5412/97, Vol. 2—That reserve No. 4768 (South Perth Lot 402) should vest in and be held by the South Perth Road Board in trust for Kindergarten and Infant Health Clinic.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage  
and Drainage Act, 1909.

Esperance Road Board.

#### ALBANY HARBOUR BOARD ACT, 1926.

Albany Harbour Board—Resolution.

C.S.D. 299/50, Ex. Co. No. 1090.

THE Albany Harbour Board constituted under and by virtue of the Albany Harbour Board Act, 1926, and acting pursuant to section 61 of the said Act doth hereby amend the Regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of March, 1951, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder:—

#### Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. By deleting from Regulation No. 1, under the heading "Tons", the word "net" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "gross".
2. By deleting the headings "Harbour Dues", "Port Dues" and "Berthing Dues" where occurring before Regulations 54, 55 and 66, and deleting Regulations 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69 and 70, and inserting in lieu thereof the heading "Conservancy Dues" and the following new Regulations.

#### No. 54.

Payment of Conservancy Dues.—All vessels entering the Port shall, unless hereinafter exempted, pay the Conservancy Dues prescribed by these Regulations.

#### No. 55.

Exemption from Payment.—The following vessels shall be exempted from Conservancy Dues:—

- (1) All vessels of war.
- (2) All vessels owned by the Government of any of Her Britannic Majesty's States or Dominions, provided such vessels are not engaged in trade.
- (3) All vessels chartered on behalf of Her Majesty.
- (4) All vessels employed solely for mission work in connection with some religious body.
- (5) All vessels being solely pleasure yachts, not engaged in trade or plying for hire.
- (6) Fishing vessels of less than 25 tons gross register,



Where, however, in the cases of Nos. (4), (5) and (6) a wharf berth is occupied, it is competent for the Board to insist upon payment of minimum Dues as provided in Regulation 58.

No. 56.

Certificate of Registry.—The master of every vessel shall produce the Certificate of Registry of such vessel to the Harbour Master or other officer of the Board upon demand.

No. 57.

Computing time in Berth.—For the purpose of assessing the Conservancy Dues payable, a vessel shall be deemed to occupy a berth as follows:—

- (a) Where such vessel uses a berth at a wharf or jetty from the time when the first line is made fast until the last line is let go.
- (b) Where such vessel anchors in Princess Royal Harbour or King George Sound, for the actual time occupied in shipping and/or discharging cargo, and/or embarking or disembarking passengers.
- (c) A vessel which remains at anchor in Princess Royal Harbour or King George Sound, having arrived solely for orders or supplies (including bunkers) for her own use, or to be refitted or repaired, or being in distress or under duress, shall be deemed to occupy a berth for a period of three hours, irrespective of the actual time the vessel is so occupied.

No. 58.

General Rate Payable.—(a) The Conservancy Dues payable shall be assessed at one-twentieth of a penny for each ton of the gross registered tonnage of a vessel for each complete hour during which the vessel occupies a berth. The minimum charge for each entry into the Port shall be as for twelve hours, but in the case of a vessel occupying a berth in Princess Royal Harbour or King George Sound only, other than a Jetty or Wharf or as provided in Regulation 57 (c), the minimum charge shall be as for three hours.

(b) Should a vessel occupy more than one berth, the Conservancy Dues shall be assessed on the aggregate of the periods during which berths have been occupied, and where such aggregate is less than twelve hours a minimum charge as for twelve hours shall be payable.

(c) The rate of Conservancy Dues prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof shall be deemed to include the War Surtax of 20 per cent, prescribed under Regulation No. 76.

No. 59.

Whale-chasers.—Whale-chasing vessels of less than 500 tons gross shall each pay as Conservancy Dues per entry into the Port a fixed sum of £3 for any period or periods not exceeding four complete days, or 15s. per day or portion thereof for any subsequent period, during which a berth has been occupied; provided that, where such vessel does not occupy a berth the amount payable as Conservancy Dues shall be a fixed sum of 10s. irrespective of the period involved. These rates shall be deemed to include the War Surtax of 20 per cent. prescribed under Regulation No. 76.

No. 60.

Rebates of Conservancy Dues.—Subject to the conditions and exceptions specified in this Regulation and provided that a minimum charge as for twelve hours at the maximum rate applicable to the vessel shall in all cases be payable, rebates of the Conservancy Dues assessed under Regulation No. 58 may be granted in accordance with the following provisions, namely:—

- (a) Where the vessel berths within Princess Royal Harbour under any of the following circumstances:—
  - (1) In distress or under duress.
  - (2) For fitting, refitting or repairs, in any of which circumstances the rebate allowable shall be 75 per cent.
  - (3) For orders or supplies, including bunkers for own use and is berthed for that purpose for a period not exceeding seventy-two hours, in which case the rebate allowable shall be 50 per cent.
- (b) Should such distress, duress, fitting, refitting or repairs necessitate the replenishment of supplies which otherwise would not have been required, or the discharging temporarily or otherwise of any cargo not originally intended to be discharged at the Port, the rebate of 75 per cent., as aforesaid, shall apply throughout the period of such operations.
- (c) Should the loading of supplies referred to in subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a) hereof necessitate the discharging and reshipping of cargo in order to comply with any Regulation of the Board, the rebate of 50 per cent., as aforesaid, shall apply throughout the period of such operations.
- (d) Where a vessel, occupying a wharf berth, requires, prior to the commencement or subsequent to the completion of the ordinary work for which the vessel entered the port, to effect repairs or replenish supplies, then the rebate shall be at the same rate as for similar circumstances prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof, but only for the actual period so involved.



- (e) Where a vessel occupies a berth for a period in excess of that taken for the handling of cargo and/or replenishing of supplies, and such excess period is solely for the purpose of extending the tourist facilities for transit passengers, then the rebate allowable in respect of such excess period shall be 75 per cent.
- (f) Where a vessel ready to proceed to sea, is detained within Princess Royal Harbour through the operation of any precaution taken by the Military or Naval Authorities, such vessel may be granted a rebate of the whole of the Conservancy Dues for such period of detention.
- (g) The master or agent of any vessel which may, under the preceding clauses of this regulation, be qualified for a rebate of Conservancy Dues during the whole or any portion of the time in port shall, prior to or within, one hour of the vessel's arrival in port, in the case of paragraphs (a), (b) and (c), or within one hour of the commencement of the operations or delay referred to in paragraphs (d), (e) and (f), make a declaration in writing to the Secretary, setting forth the circumstances applicable, provided that where the circumstances arise during other than ordinary working hours the declaration shall be made within one hour of the commencement of business on the next working day. In the absence of such declaration full Conservancy Dues shall be payable.

## No. 61.

Vessels free of Conservancy Dues in Certain Cases.—(a) When exceptional weather conditions render it unsafe for any vessel (being ready for sea) to leave the Harbour, the Members may allow such vessel to be free of Conservancy dues during the period of delay, provided that written application is made forthwith by the master or agent of the vessel and such written application is certified by the Harbour Master as to the adverse weather conditions.

(b) Where any vessel enters the Port solely for the purpose of landing a sick or injured person and remains for such time only as may be necessary for that purpose, and provided that the master or agent of such vessel submits a written declaration as to the circumstances, the Members may, in their discretion, allow such vessel to be free of Conservancy Dues.

## No. 62.

Coasting Vessels.—Coasting vessels in commission, not exceeding 750 tons gross register, shall pay half the amount of Conservancy Dues prescribed for other vessels in like circumstances or like positions. Vessels shall be deemed to be in commission until such time as the owners thereof notify the Board in writing that they intend to lay their vessels up. Vessels so laid up shall pay to the Board a special lay-up fee of 10s. per week.

## No. 63.

Hulks, Tugs, etc.—Hulks, tugs, passenger steamers, lighters and barges using the wharves or waters of the Port shall pay, as Conservancy Dues, an annual fee as follows:—

Tugs, lighters and barges (50 tons gross measurement and under)—each, £3 per annum.

Tugs, passenger steamers, lighters, barges, coal and other hulks, and licensed launches (over 50 tons gross measurement)—each £12 per annum.

The above fees are payable half-yearly in advance, to be calculated from 1st day of January and July of each year.

Hulks, lighters, and other non-seagoing vessels shall not be allowed to occupy berths when vessels with cargo or passengers require same. The above fees shall be deemed to include War Surtax of 20 per cent. prescribed under Regulation No. 76.

## Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 26 of Division 6—Midwifery Nurse's Training Hospitals—is amended by inserting after paragraph (h) a new paragraph (ha) as follows:—  
(ha) Provision is made in Appendix VIA to these regulations for the instruction and examination of Midwifery Nurses and trainee midwifery nurses in the administration of nitrous oxide and air, trilene or other agents approved by the Board.
2. Insert after Appendix VI a new Appendix VIA as follows:—

## Appendix VIA.

The instruction and examination of Midwifery Nurses in the administration of nitrous oxide and air, trilene or other agents shall be as follows:—

1. The minimum instruction to be provided by an institution approved for the purpose shall be—
  - (a) for its own midwifery nurses and trainee midwifery nurses:—
    - (i) At least three lecture-demonstrations by a specialist anaesthetist, one of the lectures to deal with the emergencies of anaesthesia and care of the unconscious patient.
    - (ii) At least three lecture-demonstrations by a sister who has been trained and certified as competent in these procedures.
    - (iii) The administration of nitrous oxide and air, trilene or other agents approved by the Board to at least 15 patients in labour by means of a recognised and approved apparatus under the detailed supervision of a midwifery nurse who is well qualified in the use of the apparatus, or a resident medical officer who is similarly qualified.
  - (b) For midwifery nurses not on the staff of the approved institution, if such midwifery nurses are admitted to the course, three lecture-demonstrations, one of these to deal with the emergencies of anaesthesia and care of the unconscious patient, at least three lecture-demonstrations by a sister who has been trained and certified as competent in these procedures, and the administration of nitrous oxide and air, trilene or other agents approved by the Board, to at least 15 cases, as prescribed in 1 (a) (iii) above. A midwifery nurse attending the course of instruction shall attend full time for at least two consecutive weeks.

2. For the purpose of these instructions the term "recognised apparatus" means an apparatus which has been recognised by the Board as one which may be used by midwifery nurses.

A standard trilene inhaler for obstetrical analgesia is deemed to be a recognised apparatus.

3. A midwifery nurse, or trainee-midwifery nurse, on completing the prescribed course, shall be tested to ascertain her standard of proficiency in the use of the recognised apparatus, the tests being conducted by the specialist anaesthetist who has given the lectures, a member of the obstetric staff of the approved institution and the matron of the approved institution (or in her absence the midwifery nurse or resident medical officer who has undertaken the detailed supervision of the practical work),

4. If the midwifery nurse or trainee-midwifery nurse has attained a sufficiently high standard, the institution shall forward to the Board a certificate stating that, having complete the prescribed course, she has been examined and found proficient.

5. On receipt of such certificate the Board shall make a record in the Register of Midwifery Nurses and in due course issue a certificate of proficiency in the use of methods of obstetric analgesia in which she has been trained.

#### Schedule.

Physiotherapists Registration Board of Western Australia.

Rules.

Part I.

Meetings and Proceedings of the Board.

1. The ordinary meeting of the Board shall be held on the third Friday of each month at such time and place as the Board may appoint. Provided that should the third Friday of any month fall on a public holiday or for

any other sufficient reason, the Board may, by resolution appoint some other day to be the day on which the ordinary meeting in that month shall be held.

2. A special meeting of the Board shall be summoned by the Registrar on the written requisition of the Chairman or of any three members. Such meeting shall be held within seven days of the receipt of the requisition by the Registrar.

3. An extraordinary meeting shall be convened by the Registrar for the purpose of hearing an enquiry into any complaint made against any physiotherapist.

4. In the case of ordinary and extraordinary meetings, seven days, and in the case of special meetings, three days notice in writing shall be given by the Registrar of every meeting. The notice shall indicate briefly the business to be transacted.

5. If at the expiration of 15 minutes after the time appointed for any meeting there is not a quorum present, the meeting of the Board and all business shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

6. (1) The Board may from time to time appoint from among themselves a committee, of not less than three, any two of whom shall form a quorum, to investigate and report to the Board on any matter. The Board may dissolve any committee and may remove any member thereof and appoint another member to fill the vacancy.

(2) The Chairman for the time being shall be *ex officio* a member of every committee so appointed and if present shall preside. In the absence of the Chairman the committee shall elect one of its members to preside.

7. (1) Notice of every motion or resolution intended to be proposed at any ordinary meeting shall be given to the Registrar in writing at least 14 days before the date set for the next ordinary meeting. Details shall be included in the business paper to be forwarded to each member prior to the meeting.

(2) Every motion proposed at any meeting shall be seconded before being discussed.

(3) Every question shall be decided on the voices unless any member demands a show of hands in which case the Chairman shall instruct that a show of hands be taken.

(4) The Chairman for the time being of the meeting shall have a deliberate vote and in the event of any equality of votes, a casting vote.

8. The arrangement of the order of business for each ordinary meeting shall be as follows:—

Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

Confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.

Registration of Physiotherapists.

Recording of Students.

Correspondence.

Reports of committees.

Production of bank statement.

Accounts for payment.

Registrar's statement.

Questions.

Notices of motion.

General business.

Any other business that may be properly brought before the Board.

Provided that the Board may, by resolution, vary the order of business on the grounds of urgency or convenience.

9. A resolution signed by all members of the Board shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a duly convened meeting.

10. No resolution arrived at or any act, matter or thing done or authorised by any meeting shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting unless notice of such intended rescission or amendment be given in the notice convening the meeting at which such rescission or amendment is proposed.

11. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar and such minutes when signed by the Chairman of the same or any subsequent meeting shall be binding and conclusive evidence for all purposes and before all courts of the proceedings at such meeting.

## Part II.

### The Registrar.

The Registrar shall:—

12. Be appointed by the Board and hold office subject to the rules and during the pleasure of the Board.

13. Discharge the duties imposed upon the Registrar by the Act.

14. Be in attendance at his office for such hours and days as the Board may from time to time direct.

15. Consult the Chairman on any business requiring attention between the various meetings of the Board and be responsible for the safe custody of all documents and property belonging to the Board.

16. Find security to the satisfaction of the Board for the sum of £500.

17. Present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month and prepare and present to the Board a yearly balance sheet in the month of July in every year.

18. Receive and be responsible for all moneys payable to the Board and bank same as soon as is practicable.

19. Discharge such other duties as the Board may from time to time direct.

## Part III.

## The Register of Physiotherapists and Record of Students.

20. The Registrar shall keep a Register of Physiotherapists and a Record of Students in the form directed by the Board.

The following information shall be entered in the Register of Physiotherapists:—

21. No entry shall be made in the Register by any person other than the Registrar. The Registrar shall make only such entries in the Register as the Board may direct.

22. Every Physiotherapist shall notify the Registrar within 14 days of any change of address.

23. The Registrar shall from time to time erase the names of all Physiotherapists who have died, and shall make such alterations and amendments to the Register as the Board may direct for the purpose of making the same an accurate record of the names, addresses and qualifications of the Physiotherapists.

24. The following fees shall be charged and shall be payable on demand of the Registrar:—

## Part V.

## Complaints against Physiotherapists.

25. A complaint against a physiotherapist may be initiated by any person or by resolution of the Board.

26. Any person who makes a complaint against a physiotherapist shall lodge with the Registrar a signed statement of the matters complained of and if required by the Board shall give such further particulars in writing and shall make such statutory declarations as to the facts as the Board shall require.

27. On receipt of a complaint or on the passing of a resolution by the Board initiating a complaint the Registrar shall forthwith notify the physiotherapist concerned and call on him to lodge with the Registrar within seven days an answer to such complaint verified by statutory declaration.

28. If no answer is received by the Registrar within the time aforesaid or if received is not considered satisfactory by the Board the Registrar shall convene an extraordinary meeting of the Board for the purpose of making due enquiry.

29. At least seven clear days notice of such meeting shall be given by the Registrar to the Members of the Board, the person charged, the complainant and witnesses and such notice shall be sent by registered post or personally served, and shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting.

30. In every case a copy of the complaint shall be sent to or served with notice of the meeting.

31. The notice sent to or served upon the person charged shall state that if the said person neglects to appear at the meeting, he shall be subject to such order as the Board may think fit to make in his absence.

## Part VI.

## Students.

32. Every person who proposes to study for the Diploma of Physiotherapy shall lodge an application in the form shown in Form 1 of the Appendix to the Regulations together with any other information which the Board may require.

33. Such application for registration shall be lodged not later than a date set by the Board and advertised in the daily press.

34. The Board may accept or reject any application or require further evidence or information on any matter relating thereto.

35. Before any person is admitted to training he must have—

- (a) obtained the Leaving Certificate in English and four other subjects; this should include one science subject, preferably physics; or
- (b) attained the age of 18 years and has not been a full time student at a Secondary School since reaching the age of 16 years and has—
  - (1) passed a written test in English Composition to the satisfaction of the Board; and

- (ii) obtained a satisfactory result in an intelligence test; and
  - (iii) produced a certificate from the Perth Technical College (or a certificate which is considered equivalent thereto) of having made satisfactory progress in Mathematics I and in two of the following:—Biology, Botany, Chemistry, Zoology, Physics;
  - (c) passed a medical examination to the satisfaction of the Board indicating that he is fit to undergo training;
  - (d) shown fitness for the course as indicated by an aptitude test;
  - (e) been selected as suitable following a personal interview;
  - (f) attained or will attain the age of 17 years on the 31st December, prior to the first year of training.
36. If the Board accepts the application it shall issue to the applicant a certificate in the form of Form No. 9 in the Appendix to the Regulations.
37. All students accepted by the Board shall be required to attend lectures, demonstrations and courses of study throughout the period of three years.
38. In order to qualify for admission to the annual examination students shall, unless the Board otherwise decides, attend each year, at least seventy-five per cent. of the prescribed classes.
39. (a) Students shall pass in all the subjects specified for the year at one examination. For this purpose the annual examination and the next following supplementary examination shall be considered one examination.
- (b) No student shall be permitted to proceed to any part of the work of a higher year unless he has complied with the rules and passed the examinations set for the earlier years.
40. The subjects to be studied shall be—  
 First year—Physics, Zoology, Physiology, Anatomy including Histology, Theory of medical gymnastics, Theory of Massage, Medical Psychology, Elementary Chemistry.  
 Second Year—Anatomy, Theory and practice of Massage, Theory and practice of Medical Gymnastics, Theory and practice of Medical Electricity, Pathology, Theory of Muscle re-education.  
 Third Year—Theory and practice in Muscle re-education, Practice of Medical Electricity, Practice of Massage.
41. The annual examinations shall be held at a date and at such place as the Board may by resolution determine and notify.
42. Every student desiring to sit at the annual examinations shall lodge an application with the Board not later than the 15th day of the month next preceding the month in which the examination is appointed to be held.
43. Any student who has failed to pass the examination or any portion thereof may at the discretion of the Board be allowed to submit himself at a supplementary examination to be held in the month of February next following in any subject or subjects which the Board may determine.
44. Students failing in the annual examination in any year may at the discretion of the Board—  
 (a) repeat the whole of the year's work or such part thereof as the Board may determine; or  
 (b) be removed from the record of students and refused admission to further training.

#### Part VII.

##### Qualification Certificates and Diplomas.

45. Every student who has in all respects complied with the Act and the rules and regulations made thereunder and qualified himself for registration as a physiotherapist under the Act shall be entitled to a certificate in the form of Form No. 5 in the Appendix to the Regulations.

#### Part VIII.

##### Miscellaneous.

46. (a) The Board may adopt a seal known as the Seal of the Board.  
 (b) Such seal shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar and deposited at the office of the Board.  
 (c) Such seal shall be affixed by the Registrar in the presence of the Chairman of the Board to any writing when authorised by a resolution of the Board and not otherwise.

Part VI—Survey and Equipment of Fishing Boats, Pearlina Boats and Whaling Boats—of the abovementioned regulations is amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 62 is amended by deleting from the definition of "gross register tonnage" all the words after the word "tonnage" in line four and inserting in lieu thereof the following words:—

Calculated in accordance with the following formula—

$$\frac{L \times B \times D \times .6}{100} = \text{gross tonnage.}$$

L, being the length of the vessel in feet from the after side of the stem to the after side of the stern post measured at the line of the deck. Where no stern post is fitted, the length at the after end shall be measured to the axis of the rudder stock at the deck. Provided that the length of the counter, or overhang, aft, when measured from the foreside of the stern post, or from the axis of the rudder stock where no stern post is fitted, to the inside of the rim, or harpin, at the after end shall not exceed 17½ per centum of the Length L obtained above.

Where the length of the counter, or overhang, aft, is in excess of the 17½ per centum above stated the Length L shall be taken as 85 per centum of the length measured from the after side of the stem to the inside of the rim, or harpin, at the after end, measured at the line of the deck.



For the purpose of this formula the stern post shall mean the after or rudder post.

B, being the breadth of the vessel in feet from the outside of the planking where the vessel is of greatest breadth; and,

D, being the depth of the vessel in feet amidships from the top of the gunwale to the top of the bottom plank next to the keel, or in decked boats from the top of the covering board or margin plank at side amidships to the top of the bottom plank next to the keel.

2. Regulation 64 is amended—

(a) by deleting from paragraph (3) all the words commencing with the word "either" in line three and concluding with the word "necessary" in line nine, and substituting the following words "Lloyds Register, the application for survey shall be accompanied by such information with respect to the vessel as the department, in the circumstances of the case, considers necessary"; and

(b) by inserting a new paragraph (5) as follows:—

(5) Vessels Over 15 Tons Gross—Except as insofar as other provisions is made by these Regulations anything required to be done by Rules and Regulations issued by Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, regarding the survey of ships shall be deemed, insofar as they can be read as applicable, to be a thing necessary to be done before a certificate of survey under the Marine Act, 1948, may be granted in respect of any fishing vessel over 15 tons gross under these Regulations.

3. Regulation 73 paragraph (2) is amended by deleting the scale headed "Minimum Requirements—Sea-going Vessels" and substituting the following scale:—

At the discretion of the Surveyor, sea-going fishing boats not over seven tons gross may be required to carry an additional anchor and rope or chain of the weight and size specified for the tonnage of the boat in the scale. Fishing vessels which do not proceed to sea shall carry anchor or anchors and chain or rope to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

In all cases where rope is used with an anchor, a chain pendant of the proper tabulated size and at least six feet in length shall be attached to the anchor.

(ii) A nozzle for attaching to fire hose suitable for spraying water on oil without undue disturbance of the surface.

(d) Vessels of 100 tons gross or over fitted with oil fired boiler or boilers, in addition to the requirements specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this regulation shall be equipped with means for the admission and distribution of froth rapidly over the whole area of the boiler room to a depth of six inches, or fire smothering gas or steam in sufficient quantities in the boiler space, with control from an easily accessible position which shall not be readily cut off from use by an outbreak of fire. Similar provision may be required, at the direction of the Surveyor, in vessels of less than 100 tons gross but not less than 50 tons gross, fitted with oil fired boiler or boilers.

8. Regulations 93, 94, 95, 96, 97 and 99 are amended by deleting therefrom the word "register" wherever it appears.

#### Regulations for the Guidance of Surveyors.

#### New Regulation 168A.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act, 1933-1950, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the regulations made under the said Act for the guidance of surveyors and published in the *Government Gazette* in particular on the 1st day of June, 1951.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 168 a new regulation 168A as follows:—

168A. (1) The fees payable to contract surveyors in accordance with regulation 168 paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (f) and (g) gazetted on the 1st June, 1951, shall be increased by 20 per centum until the next adjustment of the State basic wage in accordance with section 127 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950.

(2) Thereafter the fees payable in accordance with subregulation (1) above shall be varied by increase or decrease as the case may be on each adjustment of the State basic wage for the Metropolitan Area by a percentage equal to two-thirds of the percentage variation (any fraction of one per centum being excluded) in the basic wage for the area since the last preceding adjustment. In calculating the first variation the last preceding adjustment which fixed the State basic wage in the Metropolitan Area at £11 3s. 10d. per week shall be used.
