WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1904-1954, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Beverley: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of land, containing approximately 4 acres 2 roods, known as Beverley Lot 333, to be a Reserve for Natives. (Reserve No. 25531.)
