Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following Land, forming portions of the rich alluvial flats, on the lower Greenough River, will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on the 4th day of November, 1857, at one o'clock, at the upset price of £1 per acre, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:

None of the lands thus offered for sale and not sold, or which may be forfeited for non-completion of purchase after sale, will afterwards be procurable at fixed price for less than the upset price at which they may have been offered for sale at the Auction, or for less than the highest bidding, if any, which may, at such Auction, have been made for them.

PROCLAMATION,

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Ex-

cellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esq., Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 20th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intitled—

"No. 6—An Ordinance to provide for the payment of certain unforeseen expenses in the year 1856."

"No. 7—An Ordinance for adopting and applying an Act of Parliament intitled 'An Act to amend the law relating to Bills of Lading,' in the administration of Justice in the Colony of Western Australia."

Now, therefore, I, the said Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before-mentioned Ordinances.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the first section of an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of proper places for the burial of the Dead, passed the 12th day of August, 1847, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, from time to time to appoint by Proclamation such place or places in each district as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the dead; Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, appoint the undermentioned places as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following towns and places respectively, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same, that is to say—

Toodyay Town Lot R. 67, for Roman Catholics.

Kojonup Town Lot C, for Ditto.

Pinjarrah Town Lot C, for Church of England and Ireland.

Ditto ditto D, for Wesleyans.

Ditto ditto E, for Congregationalists.

Ditto ditto F, for Roman Catholics.

Melbourne Location 29, at the Moore River, for Ditto.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, pending the decision of Her Majesty's Government on the proposed New Land Regulations, no pastoral leases of land in Class B, will be granted for a longer period than one year.

Such leases will be issued for pastoral purposes only on the same terms and conditions as are applicable to land within the limits of Class B, but without any right of renewal or exclusion for unavailable land.

In the event, however, of the New Land Regulations not being promulgated in the Colony on the 1st January, 1858, His Excellency the Governor will be prepared to grant to lessees a fresh lease for one year on the same terms and conditions, and lessees will be entitled to exchange their leases for new ones, after such New Land Regulations as shall be approved of by Her Majesty's Government, are published in the Government Gazette; and shall come into operation in the colony.

Applications for such leases must be addressed, as heretofore, to the Honorable the Surveyor-General, in the established Class B. form; and the rent chargeable for the same, must be paid into the Revenue Office before a lease can be prepared for signature.
