Reticulation Area No. 53—Part 2.

Six-inch diameter reticulation pipe sewers with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, as shown on plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8153.

**INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.**

No. 6 of 1957.

(Registered 14th August, 1957.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 14th day of August, 1957, between the Minister for Lands of the one part and the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto, as follows: Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to an industrial agreement made on the 30th day of March, 1954, and Nod. 6 of 1954, have mutually agreed that the said Industrial Agreement be further varied, then the said Industrial Agreement shall be and the same is hereby varied in the manner following, that is to say:—

**Clause 9.—Camp Allowance.**

Delete the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

**Clause 9.—Camp Allowance.**

(a) Employees who are required to camp at the site of the work either by direction of the employer, or because no reasonable transport facilities are available to enable them to proceed to and from their homes each day, shall be paid a camping allowance of £1 15s. for every complete week they are available for work. Such weekly allowance is to cover any fares incurred at the week-end by men travelling away from camp to their homes and return, but an employee who is absent from duty without the employer's approval on the working day immediately prior to or succeeding a week-end shall be paid as provided in the following sentence.

If required to be in camp for less than a complete week, they shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per day including any Saturday or Sunday, if in camp and available for work on the working days immediately preceding and succeeding each Saturday and Sunday.

(b) Provided, however, where the employer at his own cost, provides the employee with a proper mess room and cooks the employee's food free of charge, the allowance provided in sub-clause (a) of this clause shall be reduced to 17s. 6d. per week or 2s. 6d. per day, as the case may be.

(c) When satisfactory accommodation, other than tents or huts, is made available by the employer, the allowance mentioned in sub-clause (a) may be reduced in the case of any worker, however short his occupation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer; the amount of such reduction to be agreed upon by a representative of the respondent concerned and the Union, and in the event of a dispute or difference, to be referred to a Board of Reference for determination. Provided that where satisfactory accommodation other than the provision of tents or huts, is made available in the case of married men by the employer, the allowance mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall not be payable however short his occupation of such accommodation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer. Such accommodation shall not be deemed satisfactory for the purpose of this subclause unless it is sufficient to reasonably provide for the accommodation of the worker, his wife and any of such worker's dependants who shall be nominated by him. Any dispute as to the accommodation provided under this subclause may be referred to the Board of Reference.

These amendments shall come into force as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

**IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF  
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.**

No. 12 of 1957.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Industrial Extracts Limited, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court now therefore the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

**Memorandum of Agreement.**

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

**1.—Title.**

This Award shall be known as the "Wood Extract Workers' Award" and replaces Award No. 10 of 1941.

## 3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 4.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall have effect and operate over the premises occupied and controlled by Industrial Extracts Ltd., at Belmont, Toodyay and Boddington, for the purposes of extracting tannin from wood.

## 5.—Hours.

(a) Subject to subclause (d) of this clause the ordinary hours of work shall not exceed forty (40) per week and shall be worked eight (8) hours per day Monday to Friday inclusive, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(b) Where only one (1) shift is worked daily in the establishment, lunch interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) Where more than one (1) shift is worked daily in the establishment, such shifts shall rotate weekly.

(d) Where more than one (1) shift is worked daily in the establishment, the working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week nor eight (8) hours per day between the hours of midnight Sunday and 8 a.m. Saturday.

(e) Where more than one (1) shift is worked daily in the establishment, crib time for shift workers shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes, and shall be taken in relays at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work, and no deduction shall be made therefor from the workers' wages.

(f) Nothing in this clause shall apply to the workers engaged as bag sewers at Boddington.

## 6.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work performed on Sunday or on the holidays prescribed in subclauses (a) or (j) of clause 17 hereof respectively, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, except work in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

(c) Where a worker is recalled to work after leaving the premises, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(d) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal. This subclause shall not apply to shift workers.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing subclauses, a worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours continuously without a break for a meal.

(f) Overtime for shift work shall be based on the rate of wage payable for shift work.

(g) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or to excess time owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.

(h) Notwithstanding anything contained herein:

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(i) Nothing in this clause shall apply to the workers engaged as bag sewers at Boddington.

(j) In the computation of overtime each day shall stand alone.

## 7.—Shift Work.

Shift workers other than day shift workers shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate when on afternoon shift and 10 per cent. (10%) when on night shift.

## 8.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service of all workers, other than casual workers, shall be a weekly one, terminable by one week's notice on either side. Provided that for the first fortnight the contract of service shall be deemed to be a daily one, terminable by one day's notice on either side.

(b) This clause shall not affect the employer's right to summarily dismiss a worker for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

## 9.—Special Rate.

Where a saw and/or hogger blade sharpener is required to attend to two or more blade sharpening machines operating simultaneously as well as sharpening saws, he shall be paid at the rate of 15s. 6d. per week in addition to the rate prescribed herein.

## 11.—Definitions.

(a) "Evaporator and Finisherman" shall mean a worker in charge of the process of evaporating and finishing, where finishing means all work in connection with the final process of manufacture.

(b) "Hoggerman" shall mean a worker engaged in operating a hogger machine and who handles timber from the ramp to the machine.

(c) "Maintenance Man" shall mean a worker engaged on general maintenance of the plant, but shall not include fitting or turning work.

(d) "Autoclave or Vat Man" shall mean a worker in charge of the filling of vats or autoclaves, the attention to conveyors or travelling bins (other than repairs to same) and the operations of the leaching system.

(e) "Sharpener of saws and/or hogger blades" shall mean a worker engaged in grinding and sharpening saws and/or blades of hogger machine.

(f) "General Hand" shall mean a worker who may be called upon to perform work in connection with any process of production or general labouring work in the mill, other than work which is classified in subclause (b) of Clause 10 hereof.

#### 12.—Casual Workers.

Any worker who is employed for a period of less than one (1) week (exclusive of hours of over-time worked) shall be classed as a casual worker and shall be paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed by this Award.

#### 13.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for half of one day or shift or less he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

#### 14.—Posting of Award.

The employer shall keep a copy of this Award placed in a conspicuous place in the factory.

#### 15.—General.

(a) Gloves: Suitable gloves, where necessary and if required, shall be supplied by the employer.

(b) Rubber Boots: Hoggermen shall be provided when necessary with rubber boots and such boots shall remain the property of the employer.

(c) First Aid Kit: An adequate supply of ambulance material shall be kept where workers under this Award are employed.

(d) Washing and Sanitary Conveniences: The employer shall provide reasonable washing and sanitary conveniences.

#### 16.—Meal Allowance.

Where a day shift worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof. Provided that this clause shall not apply to a worker who can conveniently return home for a meal.

#### 17.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to Clause 6 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12 monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th)

of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) or subclause (j) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(j) In the area outside a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) Subclause (a) hereof shall not apply except in the case of Labour Day and Anzac Day.

(ii) Subclause (c) hereof shall not apply but except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave at Christmas time and also the day immediately preceding Good Friday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, and the week immediately succeeding such days, with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(iii) Subclause (e) hereof shall not apply but, if after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid eleven and one-third (11 $\frac{1}{3}$ ) hours' pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(iv) Workers engaged on work during the period or periods referred to in paragraph (ii) hereof shall be allowed equivalent time off at such time as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

(v) In all other respects the provisions of this clause shall apply.

#### 18.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has not been allowed in any year to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(h) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to payment under this clause.

#### 19.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent. Shortage of wood shall be regarded as a breakdown for the purpose of this clause: Provided that a worker is given eight (8) hours' notice of such shortage.

#### 20.—Board of Reference.

(a) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purposes of the Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 21.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one (1) week.

#### 22.—Record.

The wages book (or wages sheets) of the employer shall be open for inspection by the secretary, or an accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the Company during working hours, upon reasonable notice being given of the desire to inspect same and he shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom.

#### 23.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to the respondent to apply to amend Clause 5 (hours) at any time.

Delete the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

##### Clause 12.—Sick Leave.

##### (1) Student Nurses.

Sick leave shall be granted to student nurses on the basis of two (2) months on full pay for the first three (3) years' service and one and one quarter (1½) days for each completed month of service after the first three (3) years.

##### (2) Trained Nurses.

(a) (i) Subject as hereinafter provided, sick leave shall be granted on the basis of ten (10) working days on full pay for each year of service.

(ii) If, in any calendar year any absence through sickness exceeds the worker's current entitlement, and, by service subsequent to the sickness the worker becomes entitled to further sick leave with pay, payment may be adjusted at the end of that calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, whichever is the sooner.

(iii) Any unused portion of the sick leave herein prescribed up to a maximum of seven (7) working days in each year shall be allowed to accumulate and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(b) Workers in the employ of any respondents at the commencement of this clause shall be allowed an initial credit on the following basis:—

- (i) Where continuous service exceeds three (3) years—forty-five (45) working days less any sick leave taken during the preceding triennial period.
- (ii) Where continuous service is less than three (3) years—an amount calculated on the entitlement provided for in sub-clause (a) hereto, less any sick leave taken from the commencement of service to the date this amendment comes into force.

(c) (i) The maximum period of sick leave allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed 6 months.

(ii) A worker who has been granted 6 months continuous sick leave with pay shall not be entitled to receive further sick leave with pay until a period on duty of not less than 4 weeks has been completed.

(3) General.

(a) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate, provided that if in any case it is not convenient for the employee to obtain a medical certificate, sick leave may be granted on other evidence satisfactory to the employer, but such leave shall be limited to two (2) consecutive days in any one period and a total of 3 days in any calendar year.

(b) Any period during which a worker is absent on leave without pay shall not be included as part of such worker's period of continuous service for the purpose of this clause.

(c) A worker who is absent on approved annual leave, long service leave, or leave without pay, shall not be eligible for leave under this clause during the currency of such approved leave.

(d) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

Clause 20.—Preference.

Delete the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

Clause 20.—Preference.

All other qualifications being equal, preference of employment shall be given to members of the Federation.

Provided that any worker who is not a member of the Federation shall, within twenty-eight (28) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership of the said Federation.
