MINES REGULATION ACT 1946

MINES REGULATION (EXEMPTION) ORDER (NO. 9) 1992

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 5 (2).

### Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Mines Regulation (Exemption) Order (No. 9) 1992*.

**Exemption**

2. The mine known as the Marymia Gold Project (in this order referred to as "the mine"), located approximately 230 kilometres north of Meekatharra and managed by Resolute Resources Limited, is exempted from section 38 (1) (b) and (c) of the *Mines Regulation Act 1946* for a period ending on 31 May 1995 on condition that —

- (a) a person shall not be employed to work in or about the mine for more than 14 consecutive days;
- (b) if a person is employed to work in or about the mine for 14 consecutive days, the person shall not be employed again to work in or about the mine until that person has taken a break of not less than 7 consecutive days; and
- (c) a person shall not be employed to work in or about the mine for more than 12 consecutive hours in any shift other than to deal with a serious breakdown of plant or machinery, or any other event, that causes, or threatens to cause, a danger to the health or safety of any person in or about the mine.



  - Bore J220 will be located on a 20m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 448 Lyon Road.
  - Bore J230 will be located within Lot 2 Lyon Road.
  - Bore J240 will be located on a 20m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 211 Lyon Road.
  - Bore J250 will be located on a 20m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 210 Lyon Road.
  - Bore J270 will be located within Lot 161 Beenyup Road.
  - Bore J360 will be located on a 20m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 161 Tapper Road.
  - Bore J370 will be located on a 20m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 221 Tapper Road.
  - Bore J380 will be located on a 30m. x 20m. site being portion of Lot 133 Solomon Road.

  - The pipelines will be laid below ground using 150mm, 200mm, 250mm, 300mm, 375mm, 450mm and 500mm nominal diameter pipe.
  - The route will be Lyon Road, Beenyup Road, a pipe easement, Tapper Road, Forrest Road, Solomon Road, Cutler Road, Prinsep Road and Lakes Way.
  - The pipeline will be complete with valves and all necessary fittings.
- (c) It is also proposed to upgrade the pumping facility at the Jandakot Groundwater Treatment Plant. These works will be contained within the existing Treatment Plant site in Bartram Road.

The location of the proposed works is as shown on the accompanying plan.

When completed the works will amplify the supply of water from the Jandakot Groundwater Scheme.





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
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
