LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

City of South Perth

STANDING ORDERS AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2010

Under the powers of the *Local Government Act 1995* and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of South Perth resolved on 22 June 2010 to adopt the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the *City of South Perth Standing Orders Amendment Local Law 2010*.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal local law

In this local law, the *City of South Perth Standing Orders Local Law 2007* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 May 2007 is referred to as the principal local law. The principal local law is amended.

4. Clause 1.4 amended

In alphabetical order insert —

“employee” means an employee of the City;

5. Clause 1.5 amended

Delete “; and” in subclause (1) and insert a full stop.

6. Clause 2.1 amended

Delete “officers” in subclauses 2(b) and 2(c) and insert “employees”.

7. Clause 5.2 amended

Delete items 7, 8.4 and 13 in the order of business list and insert in numerical order—

7. Confirmation of minutes and tabling of notes of briefings and other meetings under clause 19.1
- 8.4. Council delegates reports
- 8.5. Conference delegates reports
13. Questions from Members
 - 13.1. Response to previous question from Members taken on notice
 - 13.2. Questions from Members

8. Clause 5.3 amended

Delete “notice paper” in subclause 4(a) and insert “agenda paper”.

9. Clause 5.5 amended

Delete “officer” in subclause (1) and insert “employee”.

10. Clause 6.2 amended

Delete “Officer” in subclause 3(a)(iii) and insert “employee”.

11. Clause 6.7 amended

Delete subclauses (1) to (10) and insert—

- (1) In this clause—
 - (a) a “person” means a member of the public; and
 - (b) a question includes a part of a question (so that a question in 3 parts is to be treated as being 3 questions).
- (2) Unless the Presiding Member determines otherwise, a person may ask up to 3 questions at a meeting.
- (3) A person who wishes to ask a question at a meeting must—
 - (a) before the commencement of the meeting, complete a question form provided by the City and place the completed question form in the question tray provided by the City; and
 - (b) be present at the meeting when the question is asked.
- (4) A completed question form must include—
 - (a) the name and residential or contact address of the person who wishes to ask the question; and
 - (b) the terms of no more than 3 questions that the person wishes to ask.

Note—a question form that does not include the residential or contact address of the person is to be treated as correspondence—see clause 6.7(7) below.

- (5) In cases of disability or other extenuating circumstances—
 - (a) the City, if requested to do so, is to assist a person to complete a question form; and
 - (b) in the absence of that assistance, the Presiding Member may permit a person to ask a question that was not included on a question form.
- (6) The Presiding Member may decide that a question is out of order, and is not to be recorded or responded to—
 - (a) if the same or a similar question was asked at a previous meeting, a response was provided and the person is directed to the minutes of the meeting at which the response was provided;
 - (b) if it is not in the form of a question or, having regard to its content and length, is essentially a statement or expression of opinion rather than a question;
 - (c) if, in respect of a Council meeting, the question does not relate to a matter affecting the City;
 - (d) if, in respect of a special meeting of the Council, the question does not relate to the purpose of the meeting;
 - (e) if, in respect of a committee meeting, the question does not relate to a function of the committee; or
 - (f) if the question uses an offensive or objectionable expression or is defamatory.
- (7) If, in the opinion of the Presiding Member, a question requires further research or cannot be answered satisfactorily at the meeting, or if a question form does not contain the name and residential or contact address of the person who wishes to ask the question—
 - (a) the Presiding Member may determine that the question is to be treated as correspondence or is to be taken on notice;
 - (b) the CEO, unless of the opinion that a response would divert a substantial and unreasonable portion of the City's resources away from its other functions, is to ensure that a written response is given as soon as practicable after the meeting to the person who asked the question; and
 - (c) if a question is treated as correspondence, the question, but not the response, is to be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.
- (8) Unless subclause (6) or (7) applies—
 - (a) the Presiding Member is either to read out each question or to ensure that each question is displayed electronically in a form that may be viewed by members of the public attending the meeting;
 - (b) the Presiding Member is to respond personally or is to ask another Member or an employee to respond to the question; and
 - (c) a summary of the question and response is to be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.
- (9) A response to a question is not to be the subject of any discussion, except that if, in the opinion of a Member, false information or any adverse reflection is contained in any question asked or comments made by any member of the public, then (through the Presiding Member) the Member may correct or clarify the matter.
- (10) The Presiding Member may extend question time for up to 15 minutes after the end of the minimum time for questions.

12. Clause 6.9 amended

- (a) Delete subclause (1) and (2) and insert—
 - (1) A person or group who completes and submits, with at least 24 hours notice, a 'Request for Deputation' application form (available on the City's website) may be received as a deputation—
 - (a) at an agenda briefing session
 - (b) if the Council determines, at a Council Meeting.
 - (2) The CEO may either—
 - (a) approve the request and invite the deputation to attend an agenda briefing under clause 19.1; or
 - (b) refer the request to the Council to decide by simple majority whether or not to receive the deputation and, if so, the meeting or briefing at which it is to be received.
- (b) Delete the opening words in subclause (3) and insert—
 - (3) Unless the Council resolves otherwise, a deputation invited to attend a Council meeting or an informal briefing or meeting under clause 19.1.

13. Clause 6.10 amended

Delete "officer" in subclause (2) and insert "employee".

14. Clause 6.15 amended

- (a) Delete “officer in subclause 1(c) and insert—“employee”.
- (b) Delete subclauses (2) and (3) and insert—
- (2) A member or an employee who has—

- (b) information that is provided or disclosed for the purposes of or during a meeting, or part of a meeting, that is closed to the public,
- (c) must not disclose any of that information to any person other than another member or an employee to the extent necessary for the purpose of carrying out his or her duties.
- Penalty \$5,000
- (3) Subclause (2) does not prevent a member or employee from disclosing information—
- (a) at a closed meeting;
- (b) to the extent specified by the Council and subject to such other conditions as the Council determines;
- (c) that is already in the public domain;
- (d) to an officer of the Department;
- (e) to the Minister;
- (f) to a legal practitioner for the purpose of obtaining legal advice; or
- (g) if the disclosure is required or permitted by law.

15. Clause 6.17 amended

- (2) A person addressing the Council or a committee shall extend due courtesy and respect to the Council or the committee and the processes under which it operates and shall comply with any direction by the Presiding Member.
- (3) A person present at or observing a meeting shall not create a disturbance at a meeting, by interrupting or interfering with the proceedings, whether by expressing approval or dissent, by conversing or by any other means.
- (4) A person shall ensure that his or her mobile telephone or audible pager is not switched on or used during any meeting of the Council or a committee.
- (5) The Presiding Member may warn a person who fails to comply with this clause.
- (6) If—
- (a) after being warned, the person again acts contrary to this clause, or to these Standing Orders; or
- (b) a person refuses or fails to comply with a direction by the Presiding Member,
- the Presiding Member may expel the person from the meeting by ordering him or her to leave the meeting room.
- (7) A person who is ordered to leave the meeting room and fails to do so may, by order of the Presiding Member, be removed from the meeting room and, if the Presiding Member orders, from the premises.

1.0 Plan of Subdivision

- 1.1 Subdivision of Special Rural Area No. 37 shall be generally in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan and minor variations subject to approval by the Western Australian Planning Commission in consultation with the City of Albany.
- 1.2 Minimum lot size shall be 1 hectare.

2.0 Objectives of the Zone within Special Rural Area No. 37

- 2.1 The objectives are to—
- Allow for small scale rural residential lots and business enterprises in proximity of the townsite and existing community facilities.
 - Integrate development with the landscape while providing for bushfire protection and management.
 - Utilise water sensitive and passive solar design principles to ensure effective and efficient use of resources (water and energy).
 - Provide for development on individual lots which is self sufficient in regard to potable water supply and waste water management services.
 - Ensure the residential and visual amenity of the locality is maintained through appropriate design and location of buildings and compatible land uses.

3.0 Land Use

- 3.1 Within Special Rural Area No. 37—
- (a) The following uses are permitted—
- Dwelling
 - Home Occupation
- (b) The following uses may be permitted at the discretion of Council—
- Home Business
 - Bed and Breakfast;
 - Holiday Accommodation
 - Tourist Accommodation
 - Country Kitchen
 - Cultural Use
 - Light Industry
 - Service Industry
 - Rural Storage Yard
 - Plant Nursery
 - Other incidental or non defined activities considered appropriate by Council which are consistent with the objectives of the zone.
- 3.2 To assist Council in facilitating sustainable community development and achieving the objectives of the Wellstead Townsite Strategy the following types of activities shall be permitted at the discretion of the Council—
- (a) Civic, community and cultural;
- (b) Tourism and commerce—including servicing, retailing, hospitality and accommodation; and
- (c) Business enterprises—including light and service industry.
- 3.3 In determining applications for discretionary uses, the Council shall have regard to the objectives of the zone and the recommendations and outcomes contained in the Wellstead Townsite Strategy.
- 3.4 In addition to the general development provisions set out in Parts 5.0, 6.0 and 7.0 in granting development approval, the Council may apply conditions in relation to vehicle parking, advertising signage, storage and disposal of wastes and landscape screening.

4.0 Keeping of Livestock/Animals

- 4.1 Intensive agricultural pursuits are not permitted and the keeping of livestock shall be at the discretion of the Council. Land owners shall be responsible for ensuring the

keeping of pets does not result in the removal or damage native flora or fauna or result in nuisance to neighbours and/or adjacent agricultural activities.

5.0 Building Design, Materials and Location

- 5.1 Dwellings and outbuildings shall be designed and constructed of materials in keeping with the amenity of the site. The Council will be supportive of traditional Australian rural style dwellings with wide verandahs, simple forms and passive solar orientation. Walls and roofs with natural, muted tonings will be supported. Unpainted Zinalume and highly reflective finishes will not be permitted.
- 5.2 Sheds shall be designed and constructed of materials and colour schemes which are complementary to the main dwelling on the site. Where shed walls are constructed of concrete, it shall be coloured or bagged in appropriate earthy tones.
- 5.3 Dwelling houses and sheds shall not exceed 7.5 metres in height which is measured vertically from the natural ground level. The maximum height of all outbuildings will be at the discretion of Council in order to minimise the visual impacts of such buildings when viewed from surrounding roads.
- 5.4 No dwelling shall be permitted on a single lot unless the minimum combined roof area of all structures on that lot is 350sqm or greater.
- 5.5 Except as provided for by Clause 5.6 all buildings shall be setback from lot boundaries as follows—
 - Front: 20m
 - Side: 10m
 - Rear: 20m where adjoining other Special Rural lots
30m where adjoining Rural zoned land
60m where adjoining Crown land
- 5.6 On those lots where a 'Building Envelope' is designated on the Subdivision Guide Plan, all buildings shall be confined to the Building Envelope.
- 5.7 On those lots designated with an 'Interim Hazard Separation Zone' on the Subdivision Guide Plan all habitable buildings shall be designed and/or setback to take account of the fire hazard risk of the vegetation on the adjoining Crown Land in accordance with Planning for Bushfire Protection or other subsequent Fire Protection Policy.
- 5.8 Notwithstanding 5.5, 5.6 and 5.7 above, the Council may approve a minor variation to the siting requirements where it can be justified on the basis of existing structures, vegetation, visual amenity and/or fire safety, provided such variation is consistent with the objectives of the zone.
- 5.9 On those lots identified on the Subdivision Guide Plan as susceptible to wind erosion, any site works or activity which results in the removal of vegetation or disturbance of topsoil shall require the prior approval of Council. The Building Envelope shall not exceed 60% of the lot area. Management controls and conditions requiring dust minimisation and rehabilitation may be imposed.
- 5.10 Tree Planting/Landscape screening may be required as condition of development approval.

6.0 Service and Drainage Requirements

- 6.1 No dwelling shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a supply of potable water (from roof catchment area, an underground bore or well) and a minimum of 92,000 litre storage capacities have been incorporated into the approved plans. No dwelling shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such supply of water has been installed and is operating.
- 6.2 On-site effluent disposal shall be the responsibility of the individual landowner.
- 6.3 The disposal of liquid and/or solid wastes shall be carried out with an effluent disposal system approved by Council and the Health Department of WA. Systems shall be designed and located to minimise nutrient export.
- 6.4 On those lots identified on the Subdivision Guide Plan as possibly requiring inverted leach drains, further on-site testing may be required to determine the appropriate type and location of effluent disposal system.
- 6.5 No more than one effluent disposal system will be permitted on each lot.
- 6.6 The Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision requiring the submission of a drainage management plan.

7.0 Bushfire Management Control

- 7.1 Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the subdivision stage requiring the installation of strategic firebreaks.
